

Lewis Gets 4 Years On Burglary Charge

Charles Richard Lewis, 18, was sentenced to four years in the state penitentiary Tuesday by Circuit Court Judge G. F. Skipworth. Lewis pleaded guilty earlier to a charge of burglary in a dwelling. Defense Attorney Howard Kaffun suggested to the court the defendant should be returned to Woodburn for additional corrective training.

Skipworth disagreed. "He has committed a vicious act. He knows better even if he is only 18 years old."

The judge said every man should be punished for his crime. Something must be done, Skipworth said, to stop the increasing number of criminal violations, "many of which are being committed by young men."

Kaffun said the defendant's earlier record indicates "he is the type of individual who needs training in smaller groups."

Lewis, according to police, escaped from the Eugene city jail more than a week ago. During a short period of freedom, he ripped a radio microphone from a taxicab in which he was riding and later broke into a dwelling and stole some clothing.

Meanwhile, in District Court, Robert D. Middaugh, 21, 531 West D St., Springfield, was arraigned Tuesday morning on two charges of conspiracy to commit a felony.

Middaugh waived preliminary hearing. Bail was set at \$2,500 for each charge.

William E. Ivey, 36, Eugene, was arraigned on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. Bail was set at \$2,000.

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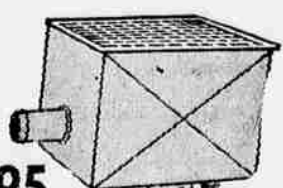
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
