

Supply Depots Bomed Again

Planes Use Napalm In Support of Troops

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—U. N. warplanes roared into North Korea Wednesday in a follow-up of Tuesday night's heavy bombing of Communist supply depots near the Red capital of Pyongyang and in Northeast Korea.

The U. S. Fifth Air Force said swooping U. N. fighter-bombers dropped explosives on Red front-line installations then dived low and unloaded napalm (burning jelled gasoline) in support of Allied ground troops in the first clear weather in five days.

GROUND FIGHTING LIGHT

The U. S. Eighth Army said ground fighting was light and sporadic.

Seven B29 Superforts Tuesday night dumped 70 tons of high explosives on a Red supply area at Pyongyang.

The Superfort pilots reported moderate flak over the target, a 110-acre area containing many supply facilities.

The Air Force said 14 B26 light bombers in another night raid attacked a Red supply concentration near Pukchong, 35 miles northeast of Hungnam.

POWERFUL AIR BLOW

The air blow was a powerful one, reported Col. William C. Lindley of Columbus, Miss., leader of the raid. He said:

"Four planes in ahead of my crew had already started 30 large fires and a huge explosion. Our run was good. We put 90 per cent of our bombs right in there and noted five more fires before we pulled out."

Four Red POWs Killed on Koje

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—Defiant Red war prisoners tested the nerves of U. N. guards in a series of incidents this month and guards "met every challenge" with maximum force, killing four and injuring 64, the U. S. Eighth Army said Wednesday.

Most of the casualties occurred at the main U. N. war prisoner camp on Koje Island off South Korea. It was on Koje last June 10 that American paratroopers broke the Red rule over prison pens in a bloody battle in which one American and 40 prisoners were killed and 140 prisoners wounded.

Kidnap Slayer To Be Gassed

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—His conviction confirmed by the California Supreme Court, William E. (Billy) Cook, kidnap-slayer of six persons, Wednesday faced execution in San Quentin Prison's gas chamber.

Date of execution has not been set.

In an unanimous decision, the seven-man court Tuesday upheld the 24-year-old former Joplin, Mo., dishwasher's conviction and death sentence for January, 1951, slaying of Robert Hilton Dewey, Seattle oil salesman, near El Centro, Calif.

Cook was sentenced to death by trial Judge Luray J. Mouser last November after a jury found that Cook was sane at the time of the slaying.

California law requires the state Supreme Court to automatically review first degree murder convictions and death sentences.

The court held there was ample testimony "from which the jury could infer that the defendant knew what he was doing and knew the difference between right and wrong."

Texas GOP Names Demos

Seek to Demonstrate Solid Front for Ike

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP)—Republicans seeking to clinch Texas' vote for Eisenhower hurled ancient party lines and snuffed out the hottest internal feud in state GOP history.

Their convention here Tuesday named a full ticket of already nominated Democrats as Republican candidates for state offices, an action unprecedented in Texas politics.

It healed a threatened split by a series of conciliatory moves and considerable back-slapping—all in an effort to present a solid front for Eisenhower.

DEMOCRAT-REPUBLICANS

Nominated as Democrat-Republicans were Gov. Allan Shivers for governor; Atty. Gen. Price Daniel for U. S. senator; former Rep. Martin Dies for congressman-at-large. Along with them went the full slate named by the Democrats in July for other state offices.

Their names, under a new Texas law, will go on the November election ballot both as Republicans and Democrats unless the individual candidates withdraw.

To meet that contingency, the convention passed a resolution empowering its State Executive Committee to fill any vacancy that may occur. It already had that power and has taken such action many times in the past.

SHIVERS DECLINES COMMENT

At the state capitol in Austin, Gov. Shivers declined comment on the GOP action and Daniel said he was "glad the Republicans admit the Democrats have chosen the best candidates." Whether they would consent to their names being on the GOP ballot remained unanswered.

Republican leaders were frankly confident that none of the designated Democrats would withdraw. They poured praise especially on Daniel and Shivers and passed a resolution commending them for saying they could not support Democratic Presidential Nominee Adlai Stevenson.

Abortion Trial Set

PORTLAND (AP)—The district attorney's office this week said Dr. E. V. Brandt, Portland chiropractor, would go on trial Sept. 30 on a charge of manslaughter by abortion. He was one of those arrested in a series of raids in July 1951.

3rd Hunt Launched for Crew of 'Wrong Target'

EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. (AP)—The armed forces Wednesday launched a third all-out hunt for six airmen missing since their B-17 plane was shot down by mistake in secret offshore target practice.

Navy, Air Force and Marine ships and planes rejoined an all-night skeleton force at dawn to criss-cross again the choppy seas into which the "wrong target" plane was sent by a Sabrejet rocket.

A public information officer here said the Air Force still held a "hope" that some would be found despite lack of any "encouragement" since two survivors were plucked from the Gulf Tuesday.

The Air Force meanwhile formed a board of inquiry to investigate the error which loosened a jet fighter's "Mighty Mouse" rocket at the eight-man control plane instead of the crewless target plane it was guiding by radio.

Staff St. Charles D. Jones Jr., 31, Meridian, Miss., told of spending a stormy night aboard a raft with a fellow crewman, Alman early Tuesday.
