Director of Skipworth Home Tells of Work for Children

Lane County's Skipworth Juvenile Detention Home isn't a jail—it's a place to help children who are in trouble—members of the Cascade Lions Club were told Tuesday noon.

Ray Baker, director of the juvenile home, traced the history of its founding and outlined the work done there for children. Since it was opened June 18, 1950, Baker said about 700 children have received care there. The average stay for a child is 9 days, and an average of 8 to 20 children are cared for at any one time.

PURPOSE NOTED

The purpose of the home, Baker explained, is to provide a place where children can be detained where they won't come in contact with adult offenders.

No child is committed to the home unless so ordered by the circuit court. Baker said workers at the home attempt to help the child face reality.

"In many cases, the kids don't need much help," Baker declared. "But a small minority need a lot of help right away." The director said he feels the need for some type of child guidance clinic to supplement the activities of social workers at the home.

HOME GETS BOOKS

After his speech, members of the Cascade Lions presented Baker with a number of books for the detention home library. The books were collected by the Lions as a civic project.

Severance Pay Bill Prepared

Bonus Would Go To Govt. Employees

WASHINGTON—Legislation to provide severance pay for Federal workers is expected to get first priority treatment when Congress comes back into session in January.

Sen. Johnston (D-S.C.), sponsor of a severance pay bill, plans to conduct public hearings next month before his Senate Civil Service Committee so the bill will be set for Senate deliberation in January.

The Johnston bill:

1. Would provide virtually all government employees, who have at least a year's continuance government service, with one day's pay for each month of service upon their leaving Federal employment.
2. Would not cover workers who were receiving at time of severance disability compensation under the Federal Employees' Compensation act, nor workers covered by the Civil Service retirement act or any other retirement system. Nor would it apply to temporary employees engaged on construction work at hourly rates, nor part-time officers and employees for whom there has not been established a regular tour of

duty during each administrative workweek, with the exception of hourly employees in the Post Office field service.

The Administration is reliably reported to favor the Johnston bill, with the modification that a ceiling of 75 days be placed on dismissal pay for those with long service records. Intent of the Johnston bill, the Senator explained, is to make up to government workers the lost equity involved in the use-it-or-lose-it leave rider passed earlier this year by Congress which now prevents workers from accumulating sufficient leave time as insurance against dismissal.

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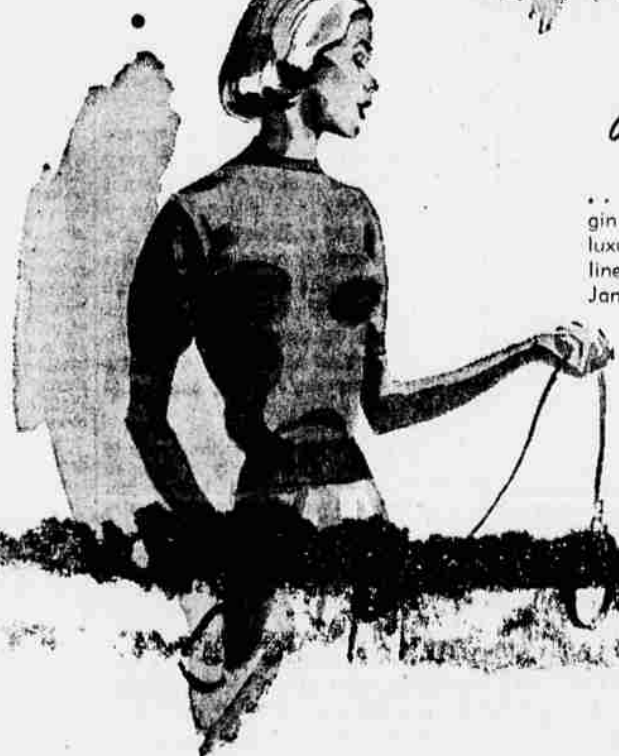
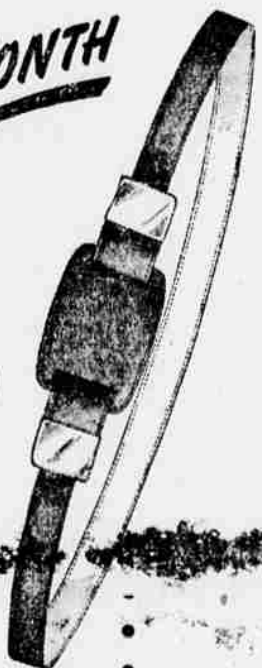
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
