

Killer by FBI

Police, Two Sons

WASHINGTON (AP)—The FBI has added to its list of "10 wanted" criminals a one-eyed family man who shot his wife and two young sons in a cold-blooded slaying. The suspect, who was captured by a policeman, is a mechanic at the Naval Air Station in Norfolk, Va., had been a citizen in the early 1940s when he was charged with the slaying of a woman and her two children. He was described as a quiet and unassuming man.

SHOTS SET

May 26, 1940, the FBI reported, the slayer fired two bullets into the chest of his wife and three into each of the children's bodies. The slaying took place in the home of the family, which was located on a street in Norfolk, Va.

Later, the FBI reported, the slayer shot a bullet into the mouth of a policeman, Rex Hamlet, N.C., who had been in the car in which Diggs was driving. His car was later surrendered to the Norfolk police. Diggs had forced them to drive him from the Hamlet.

EXTREMELY DANGEROUS

FBI described Diggs as about 6 feet, 1 inch tall, with a dark brown complexion. He has a small mustache and is a shooting enthusiast. Diggs is known to carry the .38 Smith & Wesson revolver and is considered by the FBI as an "extremely dangerous" and "excellent" marksman.

Truman May Come to Lebanon

LEBANON, Ore. (AP)—President Truman has been invited to attend—and Public Health Service officials in Washington, D.C. said he may accept—the dedication of this Willamette Valley community's new hospital.

The \$750,000 hospital is the 1,000th institution to be built with financial aid from the federal government under the Hill-Burton Act. The government contributed about one-third of the total cost. The Lebanon Express reported Tuesday that Mr. Truman would be in the Pacific Northwest in October to dedicate the Hungry Horse Dam in Montana. The paper reported that Public Health officials in Washington said it was very likely that the President would then continue on to Oregon for the hospital dedication.

Three Men Held For Store Thefts

**Robbery Series
Believed at End**

PORTLAND (AP)—Three men, including an ex-convict, were in custody Wednesday for their part in a series of Safeway store cigarette robberies and three others were being questioned about the thefts which police said netted the burglars an estimated \$20,000 over a period of two years.

Charged with burglary and held under \$5000 bail each were Albert F. Davis, 31, ex-convict serving out an 180-day jail sentence here; Charles Junior Emery, 27, Portland, and Harry Alex Beck, 35, transient. Police said all three had signed confessions to taking part in at least some of the Safeway store robberies.

Charles Merrill Emery, 46, Emery's father; Holly Jenkins, 42, a transient, and Howard Dean Emery, 18, Charles Emery's cousin, were held for questioning.

Detective Walter Smith said Emery and Beck were believed responsible for breaking into 22 Safeway stores and taking an average of 1000 cartons of cigarettes at a time. The burglaries have been going on at intervals since March, 1951.

Smith said the cigarettes were sold for \$1 a carton "wherever they could get rid of them." He said the burglars were believed to have realized some \$20,000 in resales.

Detectives said Davis has a long criminal record and has served prison terms in Wyoming, Nebraska and Missouri.

PARKED AUTOS 'CAUSE' LADY DRIVERS' TROUBLE

It was a bad day for the ladies. Records in the police department Wednesday morning showed three women drivers arrested in the previous 24 hours—all of them for being hit by parked cars. Police cited the drivers, however, instead of the cars.

Billie Jo Barker, 22, of 354 E. 14th, was cited for failure to yield the right-of-way, after an accident at 14th and Alder at 9:40 a.m. Tuesday. The car she was driving collided with one driven by John Elgin Woody, 52, of Rt. 1, Veneta, and a parked sedan.

Shortly after midnight a car driven by Betty Jane Doble, 29, of 1510 Washington, tangled with a parked taxi and a parked sedan at 10th and Pearl. She was cited for making an improper left turn into a two-way street.

At 3:30 a.m. Wednesday Margie May Pavlik, 27, 2887 Potter St., was driving at 11th and Almaden when she tangled with a parked pick-up truck. She was cited for reckless driving and taken to Sacred Heart Hospital, where she was reported in good shape.

Adeline C. Inks, a passenger in the car Mrs. Pavlik was driving, was treated for a mouth injury at Sacred Heart, and released.

U. N. Secretary Enters Greek-Bulgar Dispute

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Greece has asked U. N. Secretary-General Trygve Lie to try to mediate with Bulgaria a settlement of the Bulgarian-Greek boundary in the Evros River. The U. N. said this week the request has been transmitted to Bulgaria.

In late July and early August Greece charged Bulgarian soldiers violated the boundary and some shots were exchanged between border patrols. Alpha, Beta and Gamma Islands in the Evros River figured in the incidents.

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
