

Terrapin Back In Tidelands

WASHINGTON (AP)—Diamonding nets and invading crab pots back terrapin, once the rare offering of the gulf fisheries, is now headed for the average American table.

From near-extinction at the turn of the century, the turtles of Maryland's tidelands area are on the comeback trail, the National Geographic Society reports. With only a slight demand for them in recent years, the price dropped so that Chesapeake Bay watermen did not bother to catch them.

The result was a remarkable natural increase in diamondback population. They are clogging fish-

The tidewater states of Virginia and Maryland therefore are planning to take advantage of the abundance by putting the terrapin back on the nation's table for families of average income.

Several problems seem likely to interfere with the plan. One is that no satisfactory method of freezing or canning terrapin has been discovered. Also, popularization is being slowed by the tendency of fancy restaurants and clubs to keep the price of the diamondback dinner traditionally high.

Radioactive DDT Aids OSC Research in Mosquito Control

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—Conducting the trials are A. W. Lindquist and C. M. Gjullin of the Corvallis branch of USDA's bureau of entomology and plant quarantine, and Dr. Joseph S. Butts, head of the OSC department of agricultural chemistry and a national authority on radioactive materials.

DDT made radioactive with "hot" carbon, is being used by the scientists to measure the amount of the chemical absorbed by the insects, their developed resistance, and the killing power of the insecticide under varied conditions.

Douglas Fir Sawmills Maintain Good Pace

PORTLAND (AP)—The Northwest's Douglas fir sawmills at the end of August continued to maintain their second highest production, orders and shipment records in the industry's history, Harris E. Smith, secretary of the West Coast Lumbermen's Association, said Thursday.

He reported that eight months of production totaled 6,827,755,000 board feet, just 240 million below last year's all time high.

The freight car shortage, which hit hard in July and early August, improved markedly and shipments of 222,474,000 board feet per week for August were 37 per cent above July shipments, Smith said.

Mexico Offers POW Solution

PARIS (AP)—Gen. Omar N. Bradley said Friday Mexico's proposal to settle the prisoner repatriation deadlock should be studied and compared with other plans to end the Korean War.

However, the chairman of the joint chiefs of staff refused to say whether he thought the plan would work. Mexico proposed in the United Nations Thursday the repatriation to neutral countries of North Korean and Chinese prisoners who do not want to return home.

Bradley arrived from the United States for conferences with Allied officers in Europe. He was met by Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway and other top American and French officers.

Forest Lab Plans Tests On Roof Panels

Uniform loads in excess of those caused by 100-mile-an-hour wind forces will be applied in tests soon to three full-scale roof panels built by the timber mechanic department of the Oregon forest products laboratory. The loads will be applied with two 30-ton hydraulic jacks.

J. R. Stillinger, in charge of timber mechanics at the laboratory which is located on the Oregon State College campus, states that structural engineers have been handicapped in past design work by the lack of full-scale test data on the strength and rigidity of large wall and roof panels. Most current design work is based on experience, tradition, and rule of thumb methods rather than factual research data such as the tests will provide.

MINING TOWN DEMANDS HUMBUG NAME BACK

NORTH BLOOMFIELD and/or HUMBUG, Calif. (AP)—A group of residents of this once prosperous mining town are leading a fight to have the town's name changed from North Bloomfield to the original name, Humbug.

"Too many pioneer mining communities are slowly falling into decay and in another century will have disappeared," said John Kemp, a leader in the movement.

The Humbug name was given the town in 1851 when a drunken miner slapped a bag of gold nuggets on the bar and ordered drinks for the house. He said there was plenty more where he was mining. The minor gold rush he created proved profitless and hence "humbug."

Bent Starlight Sends Scientist to Africa

WASHINGTON, D.C.—A National Geographic Society scientist is on his way to Khartoum, capital of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, in hope of proving that star light bends.

Dr. George Van Biesbroeck, professor emeritus of astronomy at Chicago University's Yerkes Observatory, left Washington to complete a study begun during last February's total eclipse of the sun over Khartoum.

Using a giant telescope camera, Dr. Van Biesbroeck photographed the star field beyond the blacked-out sun, obtaining spectacular eclipse pictures. The telescope was left locked in position.

EINSTEIN SHIFT

By photographing the same star field six months later—but in the night sky—the astronomer-physicist hopes to measure accurately the so-called "Einstein Shift," an apparent displacement in the position of the stars.

Years ago, Dr. Albert Einstein predicted that one of the proofs of his theory of relativity would be the observation of a slight bending in the rays of light from distant stars as the rays pass near the sun.

The bending, he calculated would be the equivalent of only a tiny fraction of one degree of a circle—one and three-quarters seconds of arc. Its cause is the gravitational attraction of the sun pulling on the passing light rays as if they had actual weight.

CLEAR SKY CERTAIN

Khartoum is nearing the end of its rainy season, but weather will not be of concern to the astronomers this time. Their photographs can be taken on any clear night over several weeks, so long as it is at the precise second when the position of the stars matches their position on Feb. 25.

Once the concrete footings of the huge camera gun are checked for any possible settling, photographs will be taken on several nights to ensure a good plate.

The U.S. Air Force is cooperating in the eclipse studies. Dr. Van Biesbroeck is accompanied by James D. Harrington of the Air Force Aeronautical Chart and Information Service in Washington.
