

Richard Taylor To Speak Here Coming Week

Church of the Nazarene is having its former minister, Dr. Richard S. Taylor, back for revival services, Sept. 14 to 21. Many friends of Taylor will be anxious to greet him.

He has been until recently pastor of the Church of the Nazarene in Portland. Later this fall he will go to Australia to launch the work of the Nazarene Bible College there. Paul the younger son, will accompany his parents to Australia, and David will continue his studies at Northwest Nazarene College, Nampa, Idaho.

Dr. Taylor has pastored churches in Oregon, Washington, and, most recently, Everett, Wash. For several years he taught in the fields of New Testament and Theology at Cascade College, Portland.

A graduate of Cascade College, George Fox College, and Pasadena College, he recently received the Th.D. degree from Boston University. He is a consistent contributor to Nazarene publications and is also author of the widely-read book, "A Right Conception of Sin."

Ministers Open Fall Activities

The Ministerial Ass'n. opens its fall season with a 10 a.m. meeting at Congregational Church, Tuesday, Sept. 16, with County Commissioner Earl Raish as principal speaker. He will discuss the projected county nursing home, with special reference to support for the project from the churches.

The ministers will set up the standing committees for the year and in general will get started with their program. Most important on the agenda will be completion of the plans for the Eugene observance of the release of the new revised version of the Bible. Eugene is one of 50 centers in the United States chosen for the distribution of the new version which will go on sale at the stores, Sept. 30.

They will also discuss a new plan for their meetings, perhaps a breakfast schedule. Several civic projects are "on the fire" such as a church directory for the hotels, etc., entrance in the vicinity of the city limits on the highways (such as the one presently put up by the Springfield ministers) and others. One project successfully completed during the summer, President Duane E. Muth commented, was the placing of pamphlets consisting of Bible extracts, in the Greyhound Bus Depot, in connection with the American Bible Society.

The Assembly of God in Eugene will commence a series of revival meetings with Evangelist Roy Southard this coming Sunday. His introductory sermon will be delivered at the 11 a.m. service, and he will preach again at 7:45 p.m. Thereafter the services will continue nightly at 7:45, except Monday and Saturday.

Southard is well known in the Pacific Northwest and Eugene. He has ministered in many Assemblies of God in Washington and Oregon.

"Man Unlimited" is the subject of the transcribed program from the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass., which will be heard over Station KERG Saturday.

Distinguished Clergyman Comes To Springfield as Speaker

Dr. J. Elwin Wright of Boston, Mass., executive secretary of the Commission on International Relations, will speak Sunday, Sept. 14, 1952, at the Free Methodist Church in Springfield.

Dr. Wright has very recently returned from a trip around the world, taken in company with Dr. Paul S. Rees of Minneapolis, president of the National Association of Evangelicals. He devoted his entire time to conferences with leaders in various countries and to addresses on this work. He has a highly interesting story to tell of the progress which has been made in India, Pakistan, Formosa, Ceylon, Japan, and other countries in uniting evangelicals for fellowship and action along lines of mutual interest. He has pictures, also, of the international conference held in Holland in the summer of 1951.

"Anchors Aweigh" At Kindergarten, Assembly of God

The Eugene Christian Kindergarten at 13th Avenue West and Madison Street will commence its fourth year on this coming Monday, September 15th, with a capacity enrollment of 150 students.

Two additional classes for five-year old children have been added this year and an additional teacher employed to accommodate the growing demand. There are now four classes for five year olds, and two for four year old pre-kindergarten children.

The faculty consists of Mrs. Norman Campbell, supervisor; Miss Naomi Hixson, registrar, and Mrs. Kenneth Stiggins, all of whom have taken special studies in the field of education and child pedagogy.

Forenoon classes are from 9 to 11:15 o'clock, while afternoon classes meet from 1 to 3:15. Monday is Registration Day, when the parents will bring their children and become personally acquainted with the teachers and facilities of the school. Thereafter, the school will operate a bus for a limited number who must have transportation in order to attend.

While the Kindergarten is sponsored by the Assembly of God, it is operated on a non-sectarian basis, according to its director, the Rev. E. Ellsworth Krogstad, who says its motto is, "Standard Kindergarten Training plus Fundamental Bible Teaching." Because of its non-sectarian character, it serves children of many faiths and endeavors to render a community service to everyone.

RELIGIOUS FILMS GET 'OSCARS'

PHILADELPHIA — Religious movies got their own "Oscars" for the first time in a ceremony here sponsored by Christian Youth Cinema Inc., a non-profit film distributing agency that circulates 16-mm. movies to Protestant churches throughout the country.

Church leaders engaged in film production attended a dinner in which the principal honor, for the best Christian characterization in 1951, was awarded to Colleen Townsend for her work in a religious movie, "Great Discovery."

Mrs. Townsend, who two years ago gave up Hollywood stardom to become a missionary, could not be present. In her absence the award was accepted by Mrs. Barbara Crawford of the Hollywood Presbyterian Church, of which Miss Townsend's father-in-law, the Rev. Louis Evans, is pastor.

Eleven film companies that produce or subsidize church movies received National Evangelical Cinema citations at the dinner. They are: the American Bible Society, Broadman Films (Southern Baptist), Cathedral Films Inc., C. O. Baptists, Family Films Inc., Evangelical Films, Gospel Films Inc., the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Light of the World Films, Scripture Press Inc., and Unusual Films (Bob Jones University).

A feature of the dinner was the premiere showing of a film, "A Pound of Flesh," produced by Bob Jones University of Greenville, S. C.—The War Cry.
