A shower honoring the bride was given Aug. 13 by Mrs. James L. Randle at 870 E. 12th Ave. Family and friends, numbering 20, attended.

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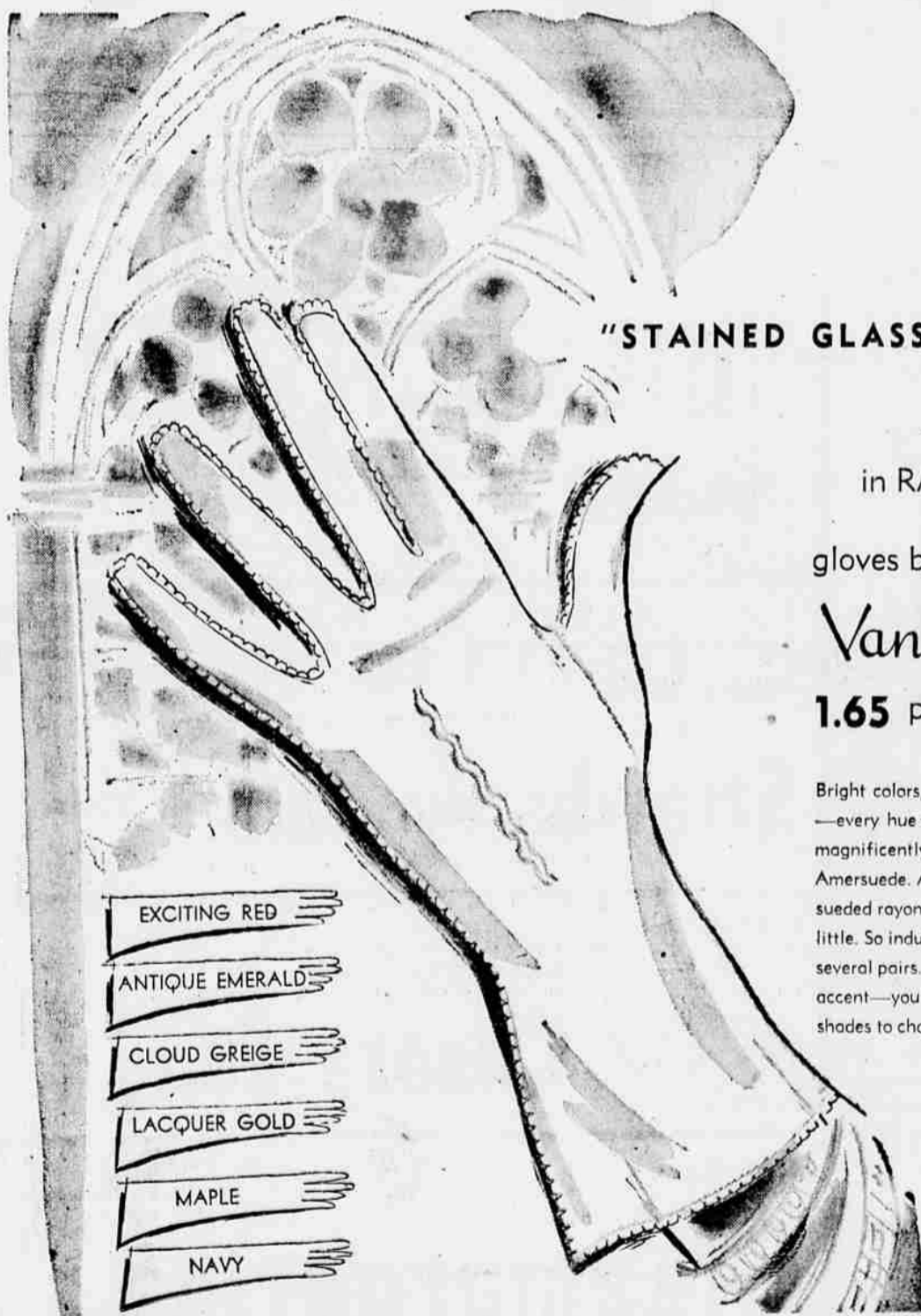
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
