

Red Rejection Of Peace Plan Appears Certain

New Allied Proposal
Offers Three Choices

PAMUNJON, Korea (AP)—The Chinese and North Korean Communists have turned down three United Nations proposals for ending the Korean truce deadlock, Peiping Radio said Monday.

TOKYO (AP)—Communist rejection of a new three-party Allied plan to break the Korean truce deadlock on exchange of war prisoners appeared certain Monday.

The plan wrapped up the Allied demand for voluntary repatriation in three separate packages.

Li Gen Nam II, chief Communist negotiator, promptly denounced the new Allied approach.

URGENT STUDY
Nevertheless, Harrison urged the Reds to study the plan. The delegates agreed on a 10-day recess and scheduled their next meeting at Panmunjon for Oct. 8.

Nam, reiterating the months-long Communist demand for the repatriation of all prisoners, willing or not, pronounced the evident doom of the new move in these words:

"I cannot find anything new. You have only used different forms and ways to decorate the unreasonable demand upon which your side has persistently insisted."

"No matter under which name it is disguised the proposition on retaining war prisoners is definitely not to be covered up by any tricks of playing with forms and ways."

In a prepared statement at the Sunday meeting, Harrison told the Communists that prisoner exchange could be handled in any one of these ways:

DEMILITARIZED ZONE
• All prisoners would be brought to the demilitarized zone between the front lines and checked off on prisoner of war lists previously exchanged. They then would be considered "fully repatriated" and would be questioned again as to whether they wanted to return to the side from which they were captured.

• Prisoners who want to go back would be handed over immediately, while those who said they wanted to stay with their captors would be taken to the demilitarized zone and questioned as to their choice by representatives of neutral or mutually agreed upon nations.

• Prisoners wishing to return would be handed over immediately. The others would be brought to the demilitarized zone and set free without further questioning. Then they would go to the side of their choice.

Truman Calls Ike "Front Man for GOP Lobbyists"

ABOARD TRUMAN TRAIN (AP)—President Truman opened his big whistle stop campaign Monday with a slashing attack on the "unholy crew" of Republican lobbyists for whom he said Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower is a "front man."

He said he was glad the oil, China, real estate and other lobbies "are in the Republican Party" and "I am going to tear 'em apart before I get through."

Truman told cheering thousands at Fargo, N. D., the GOP presidential nominee "seems to be listening to some strange advice on foreign policy" and they'd better hesitate before voting Republican if they "want to avoid a third world war."

GOP TERRITORY
Fargo was the President's first stop on a swing through staunchly Republican North Dakota, where voters have given margins to GOP presidential candidates since 1936.

Aboard the Truman train was the state's senior senator, William Langer, a Republican who has often voted with Democrats.

He heads the state party's Non-Partisan League faction, some elements of which have been wanting to formally link up with the Democrats.

The President tackled the issue of corruption in government in his first formal "whistle stop" speech of an 8,500-mile tour by saying he has been "getting rid of wrongdoers" over the "opposition of Republicans in Congress."

MOST SAVAGE ATTACK

In his most savage attack yet on Eisenhower, Truman retorted to Eisenhower's corruption-in-government charges by accusing him of using that issue as "a political football" at the direction of the private interests.

The Fargo crowd was estimated by Detective Inspector J. D. Woodley at 5,000.

Earlier, Truman spoke to 600 persons at Breckenridge, Minn., in clear view of a big "I Like Ike" sign, erected Sunday night. He described Democratic Nominee Adlai Stevenson as "the most promising young leader we have had in a generation" with a background comparable to Franklin D. Roosevelt's.

'ONE PARTY PRESS'

Truman again attacked what he called the "one party press" which he said was never for him. He said

if the big newspapers ever got on his side, "I'd know I was wrong."

Other "whistle stop" talks were down for Grand Forks, Larrimore, Lakota, Devils Lake, Minot, Berthold, Stanley, Toga, Williston in North Dakota and Wolfe Point, Mont.

It was a gloves-off attack Truman turned on his former chief-of-staff at Fargo.

He said of the Eisenhower who once quoted Truman as saying Truman would support him for anything he might want, including the presidency, that the general has swallowed the propaganda of the special interests, "hook, line and sinker."

"He may not know it," Truman said of Eisenhower, "but he has become a front man for the lobbyists."

One of the delegation labeled Louisiana Gov. Robert F. Kennon "our mugwump governor" because of his endorsement of the Republican Eisenhower-Nixon ticket.

The group—Dr. George S. Long, brother of the late Sen. Huey P. Long; Leroy Chandler of Alexandria; William J. Erikson of New Orleans, Democratic state commit-

tee vice chairman, and Severn T. Darden, district attorney at New Orleans—arrived Sunday night in the vanguard of party officials for the Southern Regional Conference. Dr. Long predicted that "regardless of our mugwump governor, we will give Gov. Stevenson a big majority Nov. 4."
