

Truman Tactics 'Low,' Says GOP

'Truth Team' Charges Hiding of Corruption

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—Barnstorming Republican Senators, from close quarter range, charged President Truman today with hiding "bungling, corruption and communism" within his own administration by resorting to "low level, ward politics" unworthy of a President.

And the three-man GOP "truth team," claimed that Mr. Truman is "falsifying the record... using the big lie technique" in assailing the Republican record on foreign, military and domestic policies.

The Senators were dug in for their "answer back" campaign in the St. Francis Hotel, only a few short blocks from Mr. Truman's headquarters here. But thus far, the President has given no public notice that he even knows the Senators are around.

Took Issue
Seeking to answer "false" charges which they say Mr. Truman making on his current whistle-stop tour, the Republican "team," took issue with the President's attack on Dwight D. Eisenhower, and his running mate, Sen. Richard M. Nixon.

Where Mr. Truman told residents of this politically embattled city that Eisenhower was the "saddest spectacle" of a man who has "betrayed himself" for political reasons, the Senators charged back that the President "got" one five-star general by firing Gen. Douglas MacArthur, and "now he's trying to get another one — Eisenhower."

'Can't Forgive Nixon'
And in answer to Mr. Truman's claim that Nixon is "not worthy to lace the shoes of California's Gov. Earl Warren, the Senators told a news conference that the president "just can't forgive" Nixon for "exposing Alger Hiss and the state department — that's why he's out here campaigning against Nixon."

This referred to Nixon's prominent role in gathering evidence against Hiss, the former State Department official now serving a prison sentence for perjury stemming from espionage charges.

The Senators took the offensive themselves by assailing Mr. Truman for a "dinosaur concept" of national defense. They said the President "froze" \$730 million appropriated by the Republican-controlled 80th Congress for work on a 70-group air force, canceled out, at that time, work on the super aircraft carrier, and pared funds for military research.

LEFT US 'ILLEQUIPPED'

"This was tragic so far as our general position as a real deterrent to Russia was concerned and left us ill-equipped for the Korean fighting," said Sen. Homer Ferguson (Mich.). Sen. Francis Case (S.D.) attacked the "dinosaur concept of defense put forward by a World War I artillery captain (Mr. Truman)," while Sen. Bourke B. Hickenlooper (I.) said the President "stalled real unification of the armed forces."

\$240,000 Haul Shows Plot on Cuban Dictator

State Rackets Net 2½ Million

WASHINGTON (AP)—Oregon racketeers owe the federal government at least \$2,674,808 in back income taxes and penalties, investigators reported Friday.

James Guthrie, acting chief of the Internal Revenue Bureau's racket squads, said that investigation of 161 cases in Oregon during the year ended June 30 resulted in additional tax assessment for \$9.

The other 102 apparently filed correct returns, agents reported. Names of those investigated were not disclosed.

Prosecution was recommended in two cases, they said.

Rackets investigated in Oregon with the number of cases and the total of recommended assessments and penalties:

Abortion 7, \$798,713; bootlegging 4, \$1,252; extortion 2, \$563; narcotics 7, \$13,206; payoffs and \$180,000.

Gambling: bookmakers 8, \$106,726; casinos 5, \$11,932; numbers 6, \$4,051; slot machines 70, \$844,667; other gambling 35, \$713,442.

Lumber Mill Burns

Truman 'Firing Noisy Blanks'

Ike Plane-Hops Through 3 States

EN ROUTE WITH EISENHOWER. ER (AP)—Dwight D. Eisenhower wound up a day of plane-hopping through Minnesota and the Dakotas Saturday night with a sulphurous attack on President Truman, saying "another campaigner" was touring the west firing "noisy but harmless blanks."

The Republican presidential nominee, speaking at Fargo, N.D., did not mention the President by name. But his meaning was clear. Mr. Truman spoke in Fargo last Monday and Eisenhower, speaking tonight from the fieldhouse of the North Dakota Agriculture College, acknowledged that the President had come to town ahead of him.

ASIDE TO FRIENDS

He said he understood the President had "fired salvo after red-hot salvo" at him. Regarding the president's "give-em-hell" stump technique as "amusing" the GOP presidential nominee said, "I've been shot at by real artillery." This was an aside to friends who may have been worried about what the President had been saying about him.

"I'm far too old to be disturbed by noisy but harmless blanks," he continued.

NO SUBSTANCE

He pictured Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson, the Democratic presidential nominee, as Mr. Truman's "hand picked candidate," and said that Stevenson and Truman together were running a campaign that was "sound without substance, howls without harmony."

Meanwhile Eisenhower issued a statement calling Stevenson an "echo" for Secretary of State Dean Acheson and an "apologist" for the administration's foreign policy.

The unusual statement on foreign policy was apparently intended to counter President Truman's attacks on the former NATO commander.

NO NAMES

Mr. Truman has said Eisenhower "misled" the administration in 1925 when he said Russian policy was guided by a desire to be friends with the U.S.

Without mentioning Mr. Truman by name, Eisenhower commented "a military estimate cannot and should not presume to weigh the political importance of the area or the nature of any moral commitments there."
