

Browsing Room Lectures Start With Talk by Schmitt

A variety of educational and entertaining topics have been selected for the Browsing Room book reviews and lecture series for fall term. The lectures will be held at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday evening Oct. 8 through Dec. 3 in the Adelaide Church Memorial Room (Browsing Room) in the Erb Memorial student union on the university campus.

Miss Bernice M. Rise, Browsing Room librarian, has just announced the fall term schedule of lectures sponsored by the university library, house librarians and the Browsing Room committee.

Opening the series Wednesday will be Martin Schmitt, curator of special collections in the university library. His topic is "Noble Fragments: Broadside History of Oregon." Slides will be shown with the lecture and Dr. E. S. Pomeroy, associate professor of history, will lead the discussion.

Dr. W. S. Laughlin, assistant professor of anthropology, will lecture

on "Contemporary Village Life in the Aleutians" and show colored slides Oct. 15. Discussion leader will be Dr. John James, assistant professor of sociology.

"The Elections and Foreign Policy: Continuation versus Liberation" will be the topic discussed Oct. 22 by Dr. C. P. Schleicher, professor of political science. The discussion leader will be Dr. William A. Williams, assistant professor of history.

The following Wednesday, Oct. 29, Dr. J. C. McCloskey, associate professor of English, will lecture on "Ernest Hemingway's Novels." Dr. Carlisle Moore, associate professor of English, will be the discussion leader.

On Nov. 5 Wallace S. Hayden, associate professor of architecture, will lecture on "Some Architectural Glimpses of Pre-Colombian Mexico and Peru," and will show colored slides. The discussion leader will be Dr. Theodore Stern, assistant professor of anthropology.

Reading from modern drama will be the lecture given Nov. 12 by Horace W. Robinson, associate professor of speech. Marvin A. Krenk, former university faculty member of the speech department, will be the discussion leader.

"Rousseau" will be the lecture given by Dr. J. M. Foskett, associate professor of sociology, on Nov. 19. Dr. John James, assistant professor of sociology, will lead the discussion.

The last lecture of the term will be given Dec. 3 by Dr. P. J. Powers, assistant professor of Romance Languages. His topic will be "Lope de Vega and the Spanish Theatre." Dr. Robert D. Horn, professor of English, will be the discussion leader.

'Ike Banners Cause Fight

NILES, Calif. (AP)—Two Republicans waving "I like Ike" banners caused a brief squabble Sunday in a crowd of some 5,000 persons out to greet President Truman at a campaign whistle stop.

The sign carriers — Proctor Jones, San Mateo County Republican committeeman, and Joseph R. Parker, both of Atherton — were booed by spectators who complained the signs blocked the view.

Ten minutes before the President's train pulled into the Western Pacific Station, Richard A. Pancoast, Oakland, took violent exception to the display.

In the scuffle that followed, one sign was demolished and a few punches exchanged, Sheriff's Lt. Joseph Sheehan reported.

Sheehan and his men quieted the rumpus, allowed the three men to remain to see the President, and then took them to the sheriff's office for a reprimand.

Sheehan said after the lecture, Jones, Parker and Pancoast shook hands and departed their separate ways. No charges were filed.
