Experts Predict Revolutionary May Achieve 210 MPH

Germany (AP)—The model of a revolutionary train which may even passengers over a single track up to 210 miles per hour will be unveiled Wednesday.

Described as "the single track railway of the future," the project is backed by a group of scientists and international financiers including Axel Wenner-Gren, Swedish-born multi-millionaire who now lives in the United States.

A model of the monorail—two-fifths normal size—already has raced up to 90 miles per hour on a testing track.

Backers believe full scale trains will be able to zip along between 180 and 210 miles per hour.

Information disclosed by the Rail Transportation Research Society here gave this picture of the monorail:

It runs on a single track elevated about six feet above ground by steel and concrete girders. The train itself encloses the rail, like a spool on a string. There are engines at both front and rear of the train, with additional motors in each car.

If tests are successful, the first monorail line may be built in Africa or South America, reports said.

'Camera Trials' Violate Rights

Refusal to Testify Upheld by Judge

WASHINGTON (AP)—A judge has ruled that a man is within his rights if he refuses to testify before television and newsreel cameras.

In his precedent-setting decision Monday Federal Judge Henry A. Schweinhaut decided that two men who cited the cameras as their reason for not testifying before the old Senate Crime Investigating Committee were innocent of charges of contempt of Congress.

TWO MEN FREED

Freed of the charges were Morris Kleinman and Louis Rothkopf, described as prominent Cleveland bootleggers.

Schweinhaut's decision is not subject to appeal. It is possible, however, that another judge might rule differently in a similar case. The judge noted that his ruling was the first in history on the question.

Kleinman and Rothkopf were among those subpoenaed to appear before the crime investigating committee, which was headed by Senator Kefauver (D-Tenn.).

They refused to testify before TV cameras and radio microphones, claiming that to be required to do so infringed on their constitutional rights.

'DISTURB AND DISTRACT'

Schweinhaut agreed. He said concentration of cameras, microphones and photographers in a crowded room "seems to me necessarily so to disturb and distract any witness to the point that he might say something that next week he will realize was erroneous."

"The only reason for having a witness on the stand, either before a committee of Congress or before a court, is to get a thoughtful, calm, considered and, it is to be hoped, truthful disclosure of the facts.

"This is not always accomplished even under the best of circumstances. But at least the atmosphere of the forum should lend itself to that end."

SP Brakeman Dies

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—Donald LeRoy Daulton, 31, of Klamath Falls, a Southern Pacific Co. brakeman, was killed near here Monday when a work train ran over him.

Charles John Shively, Beaverton, engineer of the train, said Daulton tripped as he stepped off the front end of an engine to throw a switch.

The wife, Edith, and a son survive.

Wingless Craft Makes Flight

SANTA ANA (AP)—An aircraft engineer who insisted that a virtually wingless plane could fly has built one which rose 10 feet in the air on a trial taxi run.

William Horton, 38, last week lifted his wedge-shaped craft with a long spear-nose off the Orange County Airport taxiway.

Horton said the two-engine craft is designed to prevent the air surrounding it in flight from mixing with the air flowing over its lifting contour. This is done by fins, or "sealers," at the edges of the wedge. This, he explains, gives the plane vastly greater lift.

The aircraft is 40 feet long, 15 high and 26 wide. Horton hopes to complete taxi tests within three weeks, and then take his ship aloft. He has spent 18 months and \$50,000 building the craft.

WHO PAYS CHECK FOR TRUMAN TOUR?

'Give 'em Hell' Cost Unknown

ABOARD TRUMAN TRAIN (AP)—How much is President Truman's 8,500-mile, 24-state campaign tour for Adlai Stevenson costing the government?

This was the query, relayed to this correspondent aboard the 16-car special train making the President from whistle stop to whistle stop coast-to-coast.

An editor of a newspaper wanted to know.

The answer to that question is beyond the determination of a reporter without the power to subpoena witnesses and complete their testimony and time in which to record and weigh it.

WHICH IS WHAT?

The answer would involve a decision as to exactly where a political action starts and an official action begins.

It would require a complete record not only of the salaries of everyone aboard the "give 'em hell" presidential special, but of many others the route it travels.

The Democratic National Committee has announced it is picking up the check for this 15-day speaking tour by Truman with an estimated figure of something under \$25,000.

That apparently covers the railroad transportation, meals, hotel and other such expenses of the President, his speech writers, stenographers, secretaries, clerks and others.

'Human Guinea Pig' Dies From Experiment

TACOMA, Wash. (AP)—The second of 200 volunteer "human guinea pigs" has died at McNeil Island Federal Prison, a victim of Army experiments seeking a cure for a liver disease prevalent in Korea.

The death Sunday night of Walter Harvey Wood, 39, was reported by Warden Fred Wilkinson, who said of the 200 inmates inoculated with hepatitis, a form of yellow jaundice, only 15 per cent had come down with the disease.

The men offered to help the Army find a method of fighting the sometimes fatal ailment, which struck servicemen in World War II and also in Korea.

Wood, sentenced for interstate transportation of forged securities, would have been eligible for parole next April.
