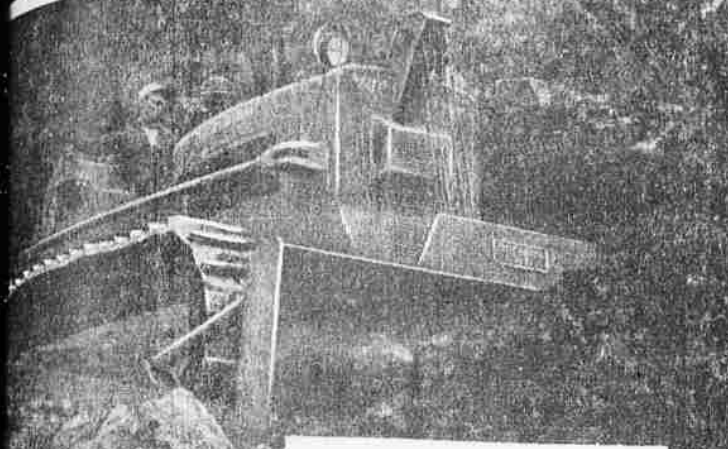


# DOZING INTO DEAD MAN'S CURVE
