

Religious Leaders To Speak at UO

The University of Oregon's annual Religious Evaluation Week will begin on the campus Sunday evening with a banquet at the Erb Memorial Union Bldg.

A five-day program crowded with addresses by religious leaders, discussions and luncheons is based on "Shaking of the Foundations"—a theme stressing the present world crisis from a religious view.

This year's program will center on Christianity in Judaism in contrast to last year's parliament of world religions which stressed the eastern religions.

All speeches and discussions will take place at the student union building. The opening banquet will begin at 6 p.m. The Rev. Paul S. Wright, minister of the First Presbyterian Church of Portland, will give the opening address, "One World or None." The dinner meeting is open to the public at \$1 a plate. Group Hears Policy Needs

The place of psychological warfare in America's relations with foreign countries was outlined Monday for Springfield Lions Club.

Dr. Joel V. Berreman, professor of sociology at the University of Oregon, backed up his outline with his own experiences during three years' service in the Office of War Information in China and its Far Eastern branch office at San Francisco.

Psychological propaganda can do some good overseas, he said, but it can not counteract what the United States' citizens themselves do. Chinese overseas will put little credence in U. S. propaganda telling of the opportunities in the U. S. when they know of injustices being practiced against Chinese inside America.

"I doubt if we can win a war of conflict with words or arms alone," he said. "We need policies consonant with the needs and hopes of foreign peoples," he emphasized.

Postal Rate Boost Asked

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Interstate Commerce Commission Wednesday disclosed a petition from the Post Office Department for a new increase in parcel post rates averaging close to 35 per cent.

The petition was filed by Jesse M. Donaldson, who went out of office as postmaster general at noon Tuesday. Dated Jan. 15, the plea for higher rates was one of his last official acts.

Postal officials estimated that the proposed hike would raise income from parcel post service by about \$130 million a year.

These sources said Donaldson had no choice except to file the petition since the package service was operating in the red.

Under a congressional mandate, the department must in these circumstances seek higher rates from the ICC or lose its regular appropriation.

The rates were last raised an average of 25 per cent on Oct. 1, 1951.
