Bank Robbery Nets \$20,000

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP)—Two hold-up men robbed the Fairfax Branch of the Bank of America shortly before closing time Tuesday and escaped with an estimated \$20,000 scooped from five tellers' windows.

The bandits, believed to be the same pair responsible for a series of Oakland bank robberies over the past 18 months, fled in a green Mercury sedan.

Assistant Bank Manager Howard Pearson said the two men came in shortly before the 3 p.m. closing time and warned the 11 employees and four customers present to "stand quiet if you don't want to get hurt."

He said one man guarded the door while his companion looted five cages, taking about four minutes to scoop up all the cash in sight.

One man was described as a slender, hollow-cheeked six-footer and the other stocky and about five feet nine inches tall. Both wore tan coats and glasses.

Columnist 'Greeted' By Process Server

WASHINGTON (AP)—Columnist Westbrook Pegler responded cheerfully Tuesday when a man greeted him as he sat in the press section at the presidential inaugural ceremonies.

Then his greeter, special process server Hugh Duffy, handed the newspaperman a two-year-old summons and a copy of a complaint in a \$5,100,000 assault-libel-conspiracy suit.

The suit was filed by columnist Drew Pearson against Pegler, Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.), the Washington Times-Herald, radio commentator Fulton Lewis Jr., and others, alleging that they tried to drive him out of business.

NEW YORK (AP)—Property damage caused by fire reached a record total of about \$784,933,000 in the United States last year, the National Board of Fire Underwriters said Monday. This was \$33,548,000, or 7.3 per cent more than for the previous record year of 1951, board general manager Lewis A. Vincent said.

Both sides in the recall controversy Wednesday were making final bids for support.

Bayly was scheduled Wednesday evening to appear on Station KUGN from 7 to 7:30 p.m. and Station KORE from 8 to 8:30 p.m. to answer questions phoned in by listeners. Questions on recall issues will be called in before and during the program.

Supporters of the recall were also using the radio Wednesday to present their case. In a tape-recorded 30-minute program, several well-known persons interviewed by R. O. Eymann of the recall committee—stated Bayly should be recalled.

Those who spoke included Tom Swartz, former sheriff; Herb Welch, manager of the Fair Board; Ralph Fosnough, superintendent of the county poor farm; Sanford Nemerovsky, fair board member; Hallie Huntington, Eugene businesswoman, and others.

Bayly, who was elected in November, 1950, attended the University of Oregon where he graduated in 1922. He has graduated from the Oregon Law School in 1936 and practiced law in Eugene until he filed to run for county judge.

AVALANCHE STATION HIT BY AVALANCHE

ALTA, Utah (AP)—The only avalanche research station in the U. S. was without scientific equipment today—due to an avalanche.

Ranger Montgomery M. Atwater of the U. S. Forest Service, which operates the research station at this resort in the mountains near Salt Lake City, said two snowslides on Flagstaff and Cardiff Mountains buried the installation's instrument tower and equipment under tons of snow, brush and debris.

"Our research installation has been set back 10 years," Montgomery said.
