Federalist Urges Stronger U. N.

World Government Sought by Speaker

The Rev. Rodney Shaw, national field representative of the United Federalists, spoke Wednesday at a meeting of local Federalists and townspeople at the Congregational Church.

Shaw, who has been appointed by the Methodist Church to serve with the World Federalists, said, "Freedom and peace are the product of just and enforceable law."

Charter revision of the U.N. has been urged by the Federalist as the means for establishing world law.

"The U.N. has only the power to recommend at the present time," Shaw testified. "Criminals can not be restrained by recommendation, but only by enforceable law. If we want the U.N. to be able to protect us against the world criminals who would plot war, the U.N. must have the power to make binding laws to the effect that henceforth no nation can possess the arms with which it can destroy the rest of humanity."

"Communists are the chief world source of opposition to world government," said Shaw. He pointed out that the Communists want the U.N. to remain weak so they can continue with their piecemeal conquest of a divided world.

Stalin was quoted by the speaker as instructing Communists in non-Communist countries to emphasize absolute national sovereignty as a means for keeping the free nations divided and weak in the face of Communist aggression.
