Women interested in making draperies are to bring the following items, one-half yard drapery material or substitute (homespun, denim, crash, heavy feed sack, cotton print, creton). Bring material with threads drawn and cut to correct length; 13-inch lining material (satin or muslin) in ivory or white; draw thread and cut to size before coming to meeting; sharp shears; drapery crinoline, three inches wide and 21 inches long; thread to match drapery material and lining; contrasting basting thread; thimble; needles, mixed sizes, one to be approximately 2 1/4 inches long; dressmakers pins; firm tape line and ruler; measuring gauge if available.
