3 More Fugitives Caught in Detroit

DETROIT (AP)—Police Monday captured in Detroit three of the five fugitives remaining at large from Saturday night's mass break-out at Southern Michigan Prison.

The three apprehended fugitives were identified as Edward J. Emrick, Virgil Lane, and Daniel B. Bousha.

Police were particularly anxious to recapture Usiondek, 37, described as a psychopath who may have sought freedom for revenge.

Authorities assigned guards to witnesses who testified at the trial which sent Usiondek to prison for life for a 1943 Detroit barroom slaying.

Official investigations sought to fix the blame for the big break.

Prison Warden William H. Bannan charged "negligence on somebody's part." He said in a formal statement "It is our duty to place the blame and let it fall where it should."

Police tracked down numerous anonymous tips without success.

The manhunt concentrated in the northwest area where the fugitives abandoned a stolen Cadillac car and released their two women hostages seized shortly after the break.

When Morse made his entry to the first floor, the burglar fled down the back stairs and escaped through the basement.

Sheriff Ed Elder theorized Monday that the burglar must have been someone familiar with the layout and procedures of the building.

At least six trees across Highway 36 near Indiana in Western Lane County were removed by Sunday.

LONDON (AP)—The Soviet government has appointed five new deputy premiers, Moscow radio announced Monday.

"As to President Eisenhower's statement on the confidential or diplomatic talks concerning his proposal, the Soviet government expresses its readiness to take part."

The United States has insisted in United Nations debate for years that any ban of atomic weapons must be preceded by an ironclad system of control and inspection for enforcement.

The Soviet Union, on the other hand, has insisted on the ban first and then controls and inspection, but has never spelled out just what

kind of controls it envisages. Thus the question has been deadlocked.

The Soviet statement said it expected the American government would clarify the Eisenhower proposal since "in its present form it is not clear and does not envisage the necessity of forbidding the atomic weapon."
