Pella, Party Said at Odds

ROME (AP)—Leaders of Italy's top political party, the Christian Democrats, Monday called a meeting to study their strained relations with Premier Giuseppe Pella.

Italian political circles were buzzing with reports of a serious split between Pella and a faction of his party headed by his old boss, ex-Premier Alcide De Gasperi.

The rumors took on new authority over the weekend when a spokesman for Pella said the Premier was "studying" some recent actions by the Christian Democrats and party chieftain De Gasperi.

Sunday Pella and De Gasperi met for a long talk which semi-official sources said was held in an atmosphere of "grand cordiality." Independent papers Monday said the meeting may have been the first step in a "clarification" of Pella's relations with his party.

Methodist Bishop Visits Korean City

PUSAN (AP)—Methodist Bishop William C. Martin, president of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A., arrived in fire-blackened Pusan Monday with Gen. John E. Hull, Allied Far East commander.

During a 14-day tour, Bishop Martin, from Dallas, Tex., will hold religious services at the front and in rear areas.

4 Killed as Train Slams Into Auto

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—A long freight train slammed into an automobile on a grade crossing here Sunday, killing four young people and bouncing the wreckage across a signal post 500 feet down the track. The train was not derailed.

The dead were identified as Jack Asbury, 21, and Roger Lynch, 19, both of Knoxville; Joanne Prater, 17, Powell, Tenn.; and Nora Hackworth, 18, Clinton, Tenn.

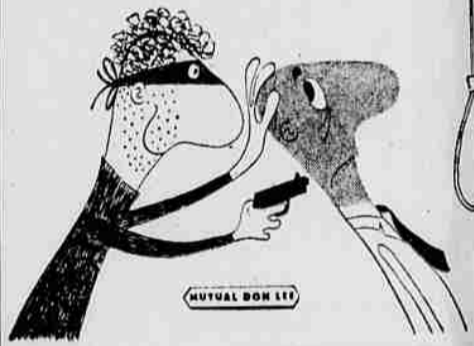
