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McCarthy: "I'm a Republican and I think I'd vote for him," she said. "I think his intentions are good and I think he has done some good for this country."

Bernadine Bartz, Eugene, sophomore at the university, said she doesn't favor McCarthy "because he seems to cause so much controversy among people."

## Iranian Says Senator Goes Too Far

Rosa Rezai, a university student from Iran, demonstrated the greatest familiarity with the McCarthy issue of all the persons interviewed. He's a graduate student majoring in political science. "While I appreciate the service that McCarthy is doing for America," he said, "I think he goes too far toward suppressing American thinking by telling people what to think and what not to think."

In his opinion, McCarthy's charge that the Army is coddling communists is unfounded. "I think all the high-ranking Army officials are doing the best for America. They're not giving away secrets. They're not supporting communism."

Rezai said he feels that the legislative branch of the government should check the executive branch, as it does in committee investigations, "but not to the extent that McCarthy has done."

What does he think people in his country of Iran feel about McCarthy?

Probably they haven't formed a very strong opinion either way, he said. "They have their own problem of Communist subversives," he explained, "and to the extent that McCarthy is going communism in America they probably appreciate his sense of patriotism."

### HOOR SPEED-UP

Russell cited the railroad's history and its current expansion program for his more than 100 years at the Eugene Hotel Saturday evening. He explained that recent shortening of train schedules made possible revised freight schedules from points of origin in California. This speeded up the arrival in Eugene of the daily North Coast Perishable train by one hour, making a delivery one day earlier than before. Between southern California and Seattle, the net saving is a full day, he explained. He also explained that the installation of Centralized Traffic Control on the line from Eugene to Crescent Lake will make more efficient use of the system's rails. He said a portion of CTC will be in place by June and the remainder by next winter.

Warden Clarence T. Gladden, however, said Friday that the windows are frosted, and that he also could put curtains up.

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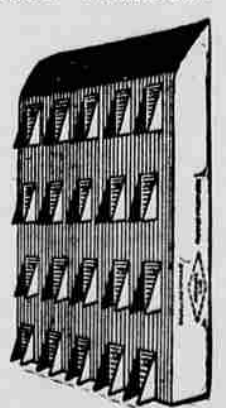
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
