

# Lutheran Hour Coverage Is Extended to Seven New Areas

The Lutheran Hour continues in its twenty-first season with the broadcasting of Christ to the Nation. The broadcast is being extended into new areas of the globe.

New areas of the globe authorized for Lutheran Hour broadcasting at a recent meeting of the Lutheran Hour Broadcasting Committee. Here are descriptions of these seven new areas.

**ALASKA:** Lutheran Hour broadcasts will soon begin over 17 radio stations in the Republic of Korea. Arrangements for the broadcasts were made by Dr. Eugene C. Beiermann, radio director of the Lutheran Hour, when he visited the war-torn country late in December. The cooperation of Korean government officials, including Christ to the Nations' representatives, is being secured in that Far East country.

**GUAM:** With 35,000 radio sets in the Marianas Islands in the Pacific Ocean, Lutheran Hour broadcasts in English has been extended to Guam. Radio Station WAGM in Agaña is airing the program Sunday at 4:30 p.m. every Sunday on 1,000 watts and 610 kilocycles. More than 100,000 people populate this island which is a large military base for the United States.

**PORT STANLEY:** In another part of the world, off the southern coast of South America, Lutheran Hour broadcasting has been extended to the Falkland Islands. The radio station in the city, Port Stanley, is now broadcasting Christ to the Nation over its rediffusion system Wednesday evenings at 8:00 p.m.

**FORMOSA:** Eight stations on the island of Formosa, have been authorized to broadcast the Lutheran Hour in recent weeks. This important nation, now the headquarters of Free China, is teeming with millions of people who have heard the Christian message.

**TRINIDAD:** Radio Station WJTB in Willemstad on the island of Curacao in the Dutch West Indies will carry the Lutheran Hour in the Dutch language every afternoon. This station has 3,500 and 5,000 watts which it broadcasts to a population of 143,000 people.

**ANTON:** Canton Island in the Pacific group in the Pacific was an important military base during World War II. The Lutheran Hour will be broadcast every Sunday at 9:30 in the morning over the station KIBS.

**MONTSERRAT:** In the Caribbean, there is a British Island of Montserrat in the Leeward Islands. The Leeward Islands have a population of 117,000, and the Lutheran Hour will now be broadcast from Radio Montserrat, located in the center of the island. The station operates on 250 watts and on a frequency of 3,500 kilocycles.

The camera also ferrets out such intriguing facts of nature as the elephant seal which suffers from stomach ulcers, a snake equipped with its own "sniper-scope" or thermal receptors, a diving spider which makes its own diving bell, a bird which flies like a helicopter.

"Prior Claim," which runs about 50 minutes, is in full color and is accompanied by commentary. It is the sixth in the "Sermons from Science" series of gospel-science films produced by Dr. Irwin A. Moon of the Moody Institute of Science, Los Angeles, a branch of Moody Bible Institute, Chicago. These films, with sound tracks in 14 languages, are shown all over the world.

# Springfield Religious Groups Show Busy Pre-Easter Themes

Highlighting this week's Springfield religious news is the appeal of the Seventh Day Adventists Dorcas Society for church help, from other denominations, with their new welfare center, in line with the recently publicized plight of Lane County's needy families. This is not by any means the only important news; one church is expanding its land ownership, another welcoming a new minister; musical and other artistic attractions are announced, and the Ministerial Association has important announcements for Easter.

The ministers in their meeting Thursday heard the assistant pastor of Seventh Day Adventist Church explain about the Dorcas Society's new welfare center at 1940 S. A. St. Merlin Kretschmar asked for cooperation of other groups so a better and more Christian job may be done for those in need.

He also reported on "religious freedom" and as a result the Ministerial Association will send letters to representatives of the House and Senate in Washington, the Federal Council of Churches, and officers in the Pentagon, relative to court martialis held in Alaska.

The Ministerial Association placed several pieces of business in the hands of committee with green lights and power to act. The Good Friday group to arrange a union service is composed of The Rev. Harold Shellhart, the Rev. Charles Boutwell and the Rev. Ernest Worden. No location has been selected but hours decided upon are twelve to three p.m. Other announcements will be made later.
