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Entertainer
For President
Caught in Gag

WASHINGTON (AP)—Backstairs at the White House:

The saddest man in the word a few nights ago was Milton Berle, the comedian who came to town to entertain President Eisenhower at the White House correspondents dinner.

When Berle reported for rehearsal of the show at the Statler Hotel he was handed a stern looking memorandum purporting to be from the Secret Service. "It is suggested," said the document, "that performers appearing before the President refrain from any reference to the following subjects:

"Congress, Puerto Ricans, coffee, golf, vacations, the state of Wisconsin or any senators thereof, fishing, painting, security risks, Jimmy Roosevelt, firearms, the South, the North, Truman."

Berle swallowed hard and said glumly, "that leaves me the war of 1812 to talk about."

"Sorry—that's out," he was told. "War involves firearms."

When it all turned out to be a gag, Berle looked like a man relieved from a horrible fate.

The current scare over gun-happy Puerto Rican Nationalists is of little personal concern to the President, although it poses a definite problem for his protectors, the agents of the Secret Service.

Eisenhower is fatalistic, much like the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt. He figures that his protecting agents are quite efficient, and, consequently, there is no reason for losing sleep over the antics of the fanatic Nationalists.

If the President so desires, he can dismiss the guests at a dinner simply by rising. Eisenhower is quite thoughtful on this point and even when he is entertaining in the White House at a stag dinner, he looks around the table to be sure everyone has finished eating before he moves away from his place.

When he goes out to dinner and the usual entertainment afterward, he stays through until the end, but his hosts are usually advised in advance that Eisenhower would appreciate it if he could get away in time to be back at the White House not long after 11 o'clock.

He's plainly not a late night man.

Benson Hints
Lower Prices

WASHINGTON (AP)—The housewife may soon get a break on butter prices.

Secretary of Agriculture Benson told Congress Thursday he may announce Monday, and certainly will by April 1, a plan for getting rid of the government's vast stock of butter and dairy products. He hinted, without coming right out and saying so, that the result may be lower prices.

Speaking of the farm price support program for butter and other commodities, the secretary said:

"The taxpayers have their money in, and why shouldn't they get something out of it, too?"

The government now owns more than a billion pounds of dairy products, including more than 285,000,000 pounds of butter, piled up under the price support program.

Testifying to the House Agriculture Committee, Benson said it is vital to dispose of these surpluses and "I think we're about ready to announce a nationwide program in that direction."

The Benson plan reportedly involves putting some of the excess dairy stocks on the market, which housewife. It is understood to be would bring down prices for the contemplate also increasing the amount of surpluses devoted to welfare and school lunch purposes.

Benson was testifying for the second day in a row in behalf of the administration's program to replace rigid with flexible price supports. He faced a largely hostile committee.

Gruenther Sees Plane Attack
As New Sign of Red Danger

OMAHA (AP)—Gen. Alfred M. Gruenther, supreme Allied commander in Europe, says Friday's attack on two U.S. planes by a Soviet-type aircraft near the German border gives new evidence of Russian hostility to the free world.

Gruenther, a native Nebraskan, spoke Friday night in connection with Omaha's centennial observance.

A Soviet propaganda campaign "to show there is no danger," he said, was belied by the attack.

"There is no new look by Molotov," Gruenther said, adding it would be a "tragic error" for Western Allies to relax their vigilance during a "long period of uneasy truce."

The NATO commander cited long range strategic air power as a very strong deterrent to aggression.

He spoke of the "growing number" of B47 jet medium bombers in the United Kingdom and in Africa. These craft, Gruenther said, fly so high and so fast "there is no defense by the Russians against them at this time."
