

Committee to Eye District 19 Budget

The Budget Committee of Springfield School District 19 will meet at 7:30 p.m. in their administrative offices Monday to give other consideration to items in the proposed 1954-55 budget. The members met last Monday at which time school officials decided to operate a three-year junior high school program with the re-opening of school this year. This program will be possible through the construction of school facilities in the district and a re-arrangement of some present usages. For example, the present Mill grade school will become a junior high. The Thurston Junior high, now under construction, and present Springfield Junior high will all house Grades 7, 8 and 9. At present Springfield Junior High is used only for the 11th grade. Springfield High will then be a three-year school, for the 11th and 12th grades. The

elimination from SHS of the 9th grade will cut down the enrollment load there to about 1,000 students, according to Superintendent E. H. Silke. Grade schools will house Grades 1 through 6, under the new system. At the recent budget committee meeting, E. W. Howells was elected chairman and Guy Wright, secretary.

State to Open Highway Bids

Bids will be opened by the State Highway Commission in Portland April 1 and 2 on \$4,800,000 worth of highway projects. Included are these three projects in Lane County: Grading 11.44 miles of the Pacific Highway (99) from three miles south of Creswell to seven miles south of Cottage Grove. Grading and paving 1.8 miles of the Territorial Highway seven miles north of Elmira. Grading and paving 2.69 miles of the Springfield-Creswell Highway five and a half miles south of Springfield.

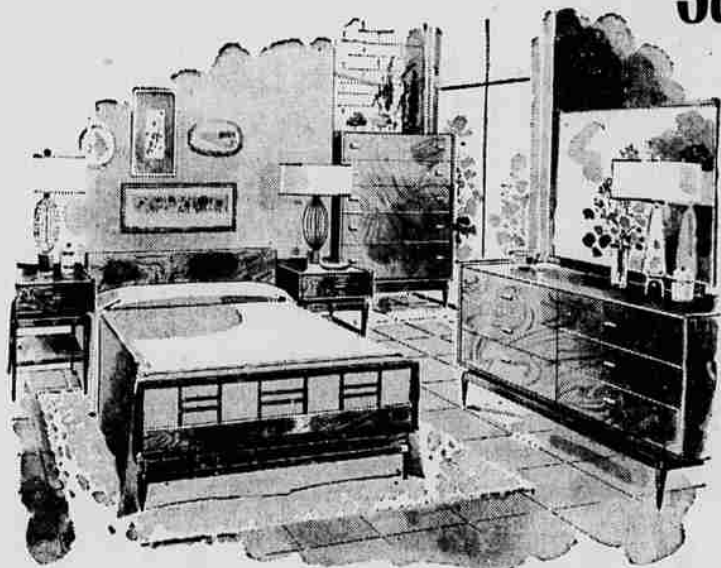

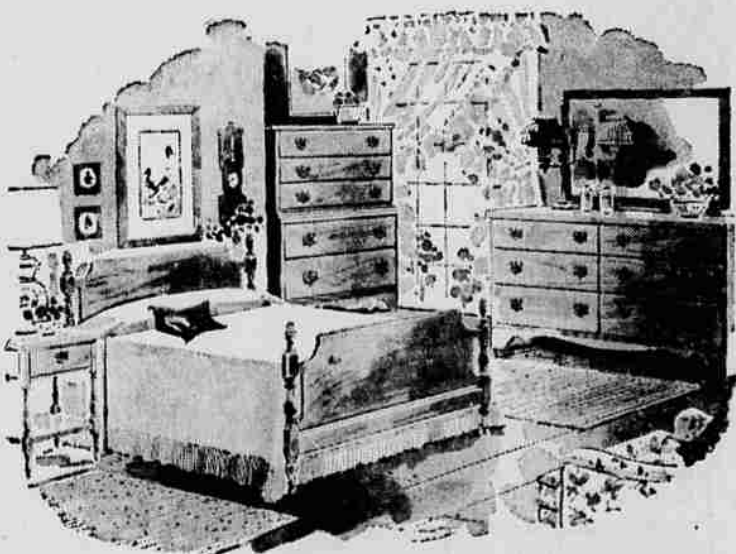
