**National YW Secretary To Speak Two Days Here**

Miss Mildred Owen, for 16 years in China as a national YWCA secretary and now on headquarters staff for the foreign division. National Board of the Young Women's Christian Assn., will be in Eugene Thursday and Friday to meet with members of the Central Lane YWCA.

Miss Owen serves as education source to national and local YWCA leadership on the work of YWCAs in 65 foreign countries. To perform this function, she helps to translate current information from the World YWCAs and from American staff assigned to YWCAs abroad into program and materials that will keep American women in touch with the problems and accomplishments of women in other countries.

Miss Owen assumed her present responsibilities in 1941, after 16 years in China, training leaders and organizing high school girls clubs. Also, in cooperation with Chinese universities, she helped to train leaders, through courses in adolescent psychology, group work and program planning.

At the end of 1952 she was sent to Puerto Rico for two months in response to a request from the YWCA there for help in organizing Y-Teen clubs and training volunteer leaders. While there she also served in an advisory capacity on other phases of YW program and administration.

Miss Owen's visit comes at a time when local Associations throughout the nation are making plans for celebrating the 100th anniversary of the YWCA, in 1955. The three-fold centennial observance will emphasize re-dedication of the 3,000,000 members to the Christian purpose of the YWCA, increasing membership and raising a Centennial fund for strengthening the work of the Association.

While in Eugene, Miss Owen will be the guest of the World Fellowship committee, Mrs. C. A. Horton and Mrs. John Jaqua, co-chairmen; the Public Affairs committee, Mrs. Ralph C. Crow, chairman, and of the Y-Teen clubs with Mrs. E. S. Fretwell, Teen-age program director.
