Two students from Willamette High School and their assistant superintendent of schools traveled to Roseburg Wednesday night to participate in a Citizenship Education Project (CEP) Workshop.

The students were John Tolleson and Donna Hinton, both of whom have taken part in CEP practices at Willamette High. Hal McAbee, assistant superintendent of District 52 schools, accompanied them.

CEP is a learning and teaching technique sponsored by the Teachers College of Columbia University in New York City. Students are encouraged to take part in a laboratory-type project through which they learn the principles of democracy by participating in community events.

The Roseburg workshop was held under auspices of the Douglas County and Roseburg Schools. Also attending was Edwin Ingles, regional representative for CEP, of Forest Grove. The Bethel District delegates explained the operation of CEP practices in District 52 during the past few months.

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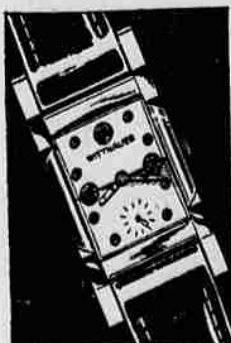
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
