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Van Fleet Son Listed as Dead

Declared Dead After 2 Years

WASHINGTON (AP)—Capt. James A. Van Fleet Jr., only son of the former U.S. 8th Army commander, was officially listed as dead Monday two years after his twin-engine bomber vanished behind Communist lines in Korea.

Young Van Fleet's name was given out by the Air Force, with out elaboration, along with 36 others carried as missing in action for more than a year and now presumed dead.

FATHER HOPEFUL

Retired Gen. James A. Van Fleet Sr., who led Allied troops in Korea from April, 1951, to February, 1953, expressed belief last fall his son was still alive and was among 3,000 or more U.N. prisoners whom he said the Reds had not accounted for.

The Pentagon for a time listed Capt. Van Fleet among 944 Americans it believed still in Communist hands, saying it had an unverified report he may have survived a crash to become a prisoner of the Chinese.

The general himself was reported to have asked many released POWs for any news of his "Jimmy."

67 MISSING

Monday's Air Force announcement said no new information to change the status of the missing 37 had turned up, so they were "presumed dead on March 31, 1954." This cuts the remaining Air Force missing list to 67.

Also declared dead were the two crewmen who went down with Van Fleet.

The navigator - bombardier, Capt. John A. McAllister of Portland, Ore., and the engineer-gunner, S. Sgt. Ralph L. Phelps, Bemidji, Minn.

Van Fleet was a West Point graduate like his father. His widow is Mrs. Yvonne L. Van Fleet, Seattle, Wash. They had one son, James.

DRUNK DRIVING PLAN DISTORTED, VENN SAYS

District Attorney Eugene Venn Monday charged his opponent for the Republican nomination with "distorting the facts" about his campaign to reduce drunk driving. He indicated he would continue with his drive to cut down on the crime which, he estimated, resulted in at least 500 arrests in Lane County last year.

The controversy between Venn and his opponent, Cecil Stickney, revolves around the issue of a "citizen's arrest," a right Venn says "is nothing new or radical; it has existed for centuries in common law."

Venn says Stickney sought to distort the issue by pointing out that it could be abused by persons seeking to charge others with traffic offenses. Venn says he had no intention of urging one citizen to arrest another for a routine traffic violation; and that abuses of the arrest are made unlikely by the criminal and civil penalties for false arrest.

"No submission need be made when no crime has been committed," Venn said.

The district attorney said he hoped during the campaign to get across to citizens the "ramifications of a false arrest and the role the district attorney's office will play in protecting those people who might be subjected to any false arrest." Also, he said, he hoped to explain fully the grounds for believing a driver is operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

NLRB Sets Union Vote

A labor election has been scheduled at the National Metallurgical Corp., Springfield, Thursday, by the National Labor Relations Board.

NLRB officials in Portland this week announced that employees will decide whether to be represented for bargaining purposes by the Aluminum Workers International Union (AFL) or the United Steelworkers of America (CIO), or neither.

Voting will be in the company locker room from 4 to 4:30 p.m. for all employees of the firm who were employed during the week ending March 1, excluding office clerical workers, guards, professional, and supervisory employees.

Neither union has a labor contract with the company at the present time, according to a spokesman of the metal firm.

Vandenberg Buried In National's Capital

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower led the nation Monday in paying final tribute to Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg, former Air Force chief of staff who spent his life building America's air might.

The handsome 56-year-old officer died of cancer Friday. He was buried Monday among the heroes of Arlington National Cemetery and under skies swept by planes he helped set aloft.

Eisenhower, a close friend, and scores of congressmen, military leaders and other capital dignitaries set aside their cares to attend the funeral service in St. Joseph's Chapel of Washington Cathedral.

Some Limitations

Giveaway Programs Get Okay

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court Monday struck down in major part a Federal Communications Commission ban on radio and television giveaway shows.

In an 8-0 ruling, the high court affirmed a ruling by a three-judge federal court in New York that the FCC could apply the ban only to shows where contestants were required to furnish money or anything of value, or to have in their possession a sponsor's product.

The special court said the commissions could not prohibit program schemes which directly or indirectly require contestants to listen to shows to become eligible to win prizes.

Chief Justice Warren wrote the opinion affirming the special court's ruling. Justice Douglas took no part in the cast, making the vote 8-0.

Warren said, "the commission has over stepped the boundaries of interpretation and hence has exceeded its rule-making power."

The chief justice added that regardless of the doubts held by the commission and others as to the social value of give-away programs, the commission lacked authority to expand the power given it under the federal communications act.

Dempsey's Daughter Weds College Student

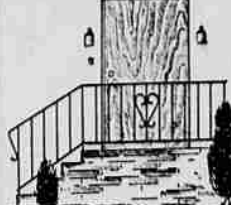
