

Daily's Alibis

...is the day the voice of Mrs. Henderson told Mrs. Henderson that she had seen a man at the top of the Butte with \$200. Then, she said, she could have the money.

...the day that Detective Henderson and Bunch testified that they didn't arrive at the meeting place on the Butte until 1:28 p.m. The telephone call to Mrs. Henderson had been made at 1:15 p.m. It was about 1:30 p.m. that Mrs. Henderson had seen the person she said was Daily at the Butte.

...backed up by Bray in his testimony, says he saw the person, drinking coffee, at the Butte, at 1:30 p.m. He went immediately to the ROTC building, he says, and there at 1:45.

...backed up the ROTC building story expected to be heard Thursday. The jury Wednesday had scraped his face on a handball game at the Butte Jan. 11. Two large juries, he said, and the jury was very noticeable.

...backed up the story of the handball game. He said he did not see Perry Neil Hall, W. 17th, a graduate of the University of Oregon, and J. E. Carlat, a graduate of the University of Oregon, in the courtroom.

...said he thought the person was noticeable at "20 or 30" while Carlat called them "noticeable."

...courtroom drama ended early in the afternoon. Dist. Atty. Eugene Henderson was cross-examining Daily.

...produced some putty and instructed Daily to compare the size and color of the putty with the color of the putty on the face of the man who was charged with the murder.

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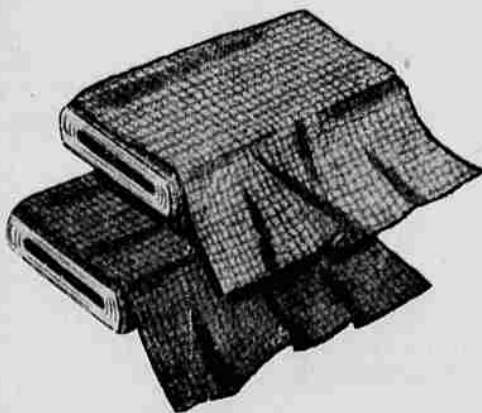
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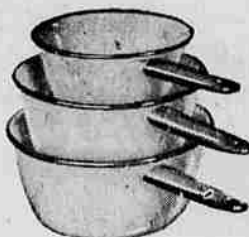
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
