Mayor Asks Children's Aid

PORTLAND (AP)—The aid of school children in Oregon and Washington is being sought by Mayor Fred L. Peterson to get another elephant for the Portland Zoo.

Peterson hopes that Prime Minister Nehru of India will give the city a companion for its new elephant, Rosy. The mayor thinks Oregon should provide India with a native Pacific Northwest bird or animal in return.

Peterson asked school children to write letters to Nehru, in care of the Portland City Hall, asking for the elephant. A name for the elephant and suggestions about what bird or animal should be sent to India also are sought.

Rayburn Blocks Statehood Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—An objection by House Democratic Leader Rayburn of Texas Monday blocked the Hawaii-Alaska statehood bill from going to conference with the Senate.

That left the Senate-approved measure in a parliamentary situation where it will come to a House vote only if the rules committee gives it a special rule.

There is strong sentiment in the Rules Committee against statehood for Alaska, so the bill may be stymied for the session.

The delicate little actress got her dander up while discussing her fish-bowl life as a movie star.

EXPECT IT
 "If you're in pictures and a success" she said, "you've got to expect and accept the fact that you give up a lot of privacy."

"If you don't like other people minding your business you might as well sell shirts some place."

Janet and her bobby-sox idol husband, Tony Curtis, find their private life written up regularly in the fan magazines. Articles titled "Why Tony and Janet Want a Family" or "Hollywood's Happiest Marriage" are old hat to the young couple who've been married almost three years.

"We're used to being hounded by reporters and fans," Janet said, "and we love it. If we don't want to be bothered, we just stay home."

"That's what irks me about invasion of privacy. All they have to do is stick around the house."

ALWAYS RUMORS
 The blonde actress currently starring in "Prince Valiant," admits there are drawbacks to the limelight, too.

"There always are rumors," she said, "but most of them are funny. Hardly a month goes by that I don't read somewhere that I'm about to have a baby."

"Any time Tony and I have a spat—and don't think we don't have some good ones—it gets in the papers. We read about our fights even when we don't have them."

Janet went on to say that stories dwelling on their happy marriage are true, but not exactly accurate.
