trolley car enthusiasts intend to
keep the old vehicles running
near here. They have their own
trolleys, and hope to lay their

Organized as the Willamette
Valley Electric Railway Assn.,
Inc., they plan to lay 1 1/2 miles
of track along the old Willamette
Valley Southern railway right of
way, five miles south of Oregon
City.

Three trolley cars owned by

stacle—\$1,300 which the mem-
bers must raise within the next
week or so to buy a motor car

Russia next month on assignment
for Look magazine.

The former first lady declined
to comment on the trip and said
any information about it would
have to come from the magazine.

tion confirmed Sunday that Mrs.
Roosevelt would go to the Soviet
Union on assignment but said the

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
