Play Season Set at Ashland

Dramatic Festival Goes Into 14th Year

ASHLAND—The 14th annual season of the famed Oregon Shakespearean festival gets underway in earnest here Monday, when auditions for roles in the coming season begin in the open-air theatre in Lithia Park.

Over 100 aspiring young actors from all parts of the United States began arriving in Ashland last week, intent on winning roles in several or all of the four plays to be performed this summer.

Scheduled for production are "Hamlet," "The Merry Wives of Windsor," "The Winter's Tale" and "Henry VI, Part 2." In addition, many will appear in the concert of Elizabethan music, two of which are to be staged again this year, during the month-long season beginning August 1.

Approximately one-third of the festival company will be veterans of performance on the unique Elizabethan stage; the rest will be newcomers. The directorial staff is made up almost entirely of veterans.

Heading the list is Producing Director Angus Bowmer, the festival's founder, who will direct "Hamlet." "The Merry Wives of Windsor" will be directed by Allen Fletcher of Carnegie Tech, Pittsburgh; "Henry VI, Part 2" by James Sandoe, University of Colorado, and "The Winter's Tale" by H. Paul Kliss of the Ring Theatre, Portland. All have directed in Ashland for several seasons except Kliss, who has starred in festival productions since 1951.

Following auditions in Ashland Monday and Tuesday, rehearsals begin Wednesday afternoon and continue each afternoon and evening until the seasons opens August 1, with "Hamlet." The four plays are rehearsed simultaneously, then play every evening in rotation throughout the season.

Plunge Fatal To Aerialist

NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C. (AP)—William Quovadis, 37-year-old aerialist, died in a hospital Saturday after plunging 100 feet from a screen tower before more than 3,000 spectators Friday night.

He fell against the edge of the tower, bounced off and dropped the remaining 70 feet to the ground.

Quovadis was a New Westminster taxicab driver by day and a stunt man at night.
