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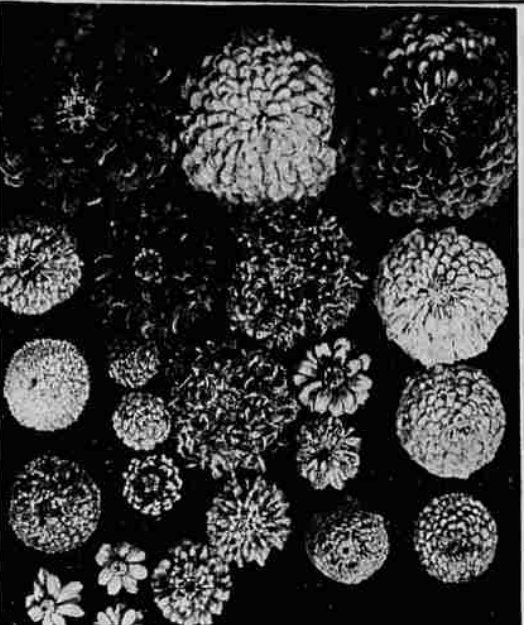

DO YOU KNOW

The highest price ever paid for a new variety of plant was a thornless rose patented in 1942 which sold for \$10,000.

Seeds from most plants which are propagated by vegetative methods (budding, grafting, layering or cuttings) practically never produce seedlings identical with the parent variety.

That "sports" or mutants may be found in any garden and may thus establish a new variety.

The great majority of seedlings of any plant are inferior to varieties already available.

READER'S QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Q—What fertilizer is recommended for annuals?—B.K.
A—A 4-12-4 or 5-10-5 formula at 3 lbs. per 100 sq. ft. is recommended.

Q—Should flowering quince be pruned now? Our bush is growing very rank and should be cut back whenever it can be safely done. Mrs. M.S.
A—This can be pruned or shaped when it is through blooming. Be careful not to trim to a too regular shape, however, as part of the beauty of this shrub is its rather irregular natural habit.

Q—Have ten-year-old bush of forsythia that has some dead wood and far too large. How can this best be pruned and when?—E.T.
A—Prune laterals back to two to four buds, after flowering, and remove any old dead or diseased wood.

Q—Please recommend low-growing annuals for the front or edge of a flower border.—Mrs. V.W.
A—Pansies, daisies, forget-me-nots, Sweet Alyssum, Stock or Candytuft.

Q—Have heard that there is a native bulb that was used by the Indians for food. Is this true and what is it?—E.H.

Close Breezeway 'Gap' With Screen

Many home owners have swapped the vexing "gap" where breezeway separates home and garage for a charming space filler. Gone is the bare and uninteresting "gopher" runway. In its place is a simple wooden screen.

Adding beauty and convenience to an unprotected breezeway is easy to do and inexpensive. The screen is a mere extension of the siding of the home at convenient fence height to bridge the empty breezeway area. It can be installed when the house is built, or later if desired.

It is generally designed as a frame and studded wall. Siding of the home, whether it is western red cedar, Douglas fir or west coast hemlock can be applied to both sides of the stud-ding.

Some architects cap the breezeway fence or screen with a wide board which provides a convenient rail for potted plants as well as giving a finished appearance to the installation.

To complete the union of home and garage into one structure, a gate of similar material can be installed. The gate can be both functional and decorative. Where home and garage share a common connected roof line, addition of the screening installation gives the entire home structure long, smooth continuing lines. Where the unprotected breezeway gives a chopped up appearance to the home, the screen gives a feeling of grace and unity.

The housewife likes this improvement in the home design for several reasons. The screen breaks the sweep of air through the wide open breezeway. It also provides a new casual storage area where lawn furniture and garden tools can be temporarily placed under shelter.

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Fast Growing Flowers Bloom in Six Weeks

You can create flash effects with seeds and plants; ornamentals started one day seem to burst into bloom almost overnight. There are two factors that make this seeming miracle possible: the temperate growing conditions now prevailing and an intelligent selection of planting material.

During hot weather zinnias are real speed burners. You can expect flowers from seed in just a little more than five or six weeks. There are dozens of varieties to choose from and as many colors. And you can hasten the flowering period by setting out established seedling plants.

Cobaea scandens, often known as the "cup and saucer" vine, because the flower formation looks like a cup and saucer is another speed burner. It often grows from twenty-five to thirty feet in one season. It is a vine and is the only climber in the phlox family. While botanists refer to cobaea scandens as a perennial it is cultivated in this area as an annual. The flowers are purple-violet. The seeds, which have a flat shape, germinate best if set on edge.

When you discuss rapid-grow-

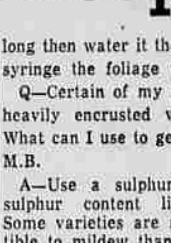
ing vines the popular morning glory must be considered. This is a splendid subject for covering fences, walls and all unsightly vistas. The plants bloom well during warm weather. The leaves are distinctive because of their heart-like shape. A few interesting varieties are: Scarlet O'Hara, velvet red; Crimson Rambler, rich red; Pearly Gates, satiny white and Clark's extra early Heavenly Blue.

Ricinus communis, which is actually the Castor oil plant, is grown for both ornamental and medicinal purposes. It is a perennial but usually treated as an annual. Even though planted late in the season it still produces a tremendous amount of growth. Ricinus communis is a tropical-appearing plant with leaves that grow to a diameter of three feet.

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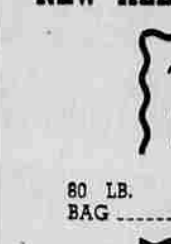
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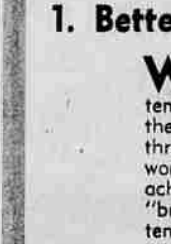
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
