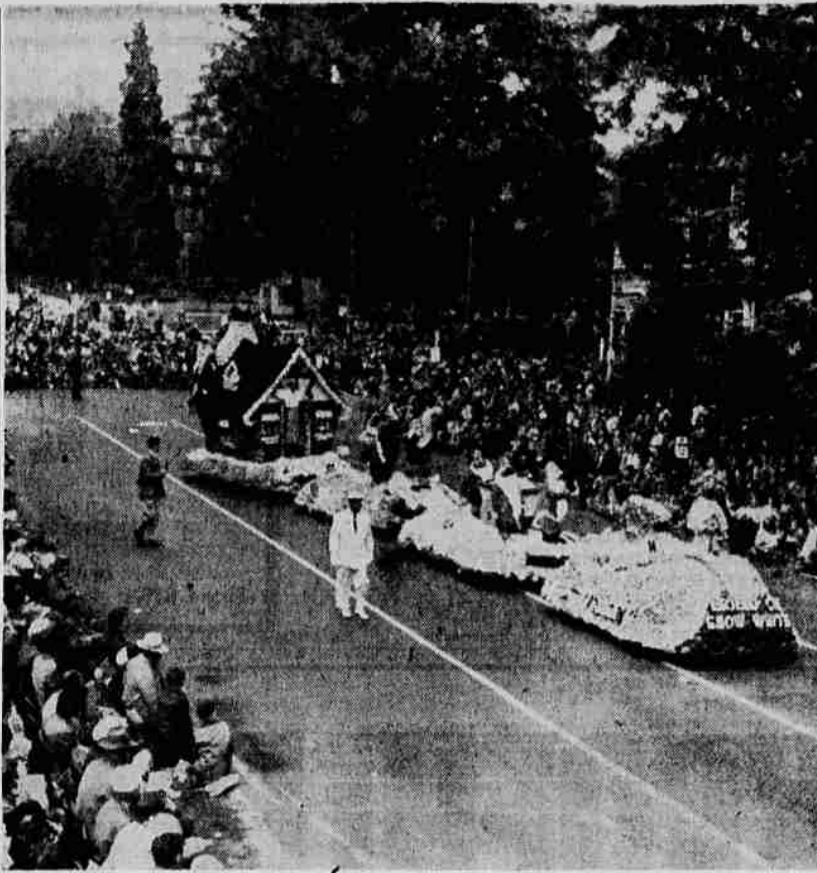

**Senate Balks T-H Action**

WASHINGTON (AP)—The status of major legislation Saturday: Labor—The Senate has shelved a bill amending the Taft-Hartley labor relations act. The House Labor Committee has sidetracked a companion measure. Appropriations—The House has passed and sent to the Senate bills financing 10 government departments and a score of independent agencies for the coming

fiscal year. In all, the measures provide appropriations of approximately 42 billion dollars. The Senate has passed five of the House bills, and one has been signed by the President. Taxes—Congress has enacted into law a bill cutting some excise taxes and continuing the excise tax program generally for another year. The House has passed, and the Senate Finance Committee has tentatively approved, a bill making general revisions in the tax laws but without a controversial provision increasing personal tax exemptions.

Reciprocal trade—The House has passed and sent to the Senate a bill extending for one year the President's power to make trade agreements with other nations. Social security—The House has passed and sent to the Senate a bill to increase social security taxes and benefits. The House Ways and Means Committee is considering a bill to broaden unemployment compensation coverage. Postal rates—The House Postoffice Committee has recommended general increases in postal rates, but the Rules Committee has failed to clear the bill for a House vote.

Pay raises—Bills to raise the pay of members of Congress, federal judges and federal employees generally are pending in the House Judiciary and Postoffice committees. A bill boosting congressional pensions has become

law. A bill raising the pay for postal employees is awaiting House action.

Treaties—The Senate has ratified a mutual defense pact with South Korea; no House action is required.

Defense and foreign — Bills financing and authorizing continuance of the foreign aid program are being prepared by the House Appropriations Committee and House Foreign Affairs Committee. A bill establishing a cadet academy for the Air Force has been signed by the President.

Agriculture — Committees of both branches are considering the President's proposal for revisions in the price support program. A bill adjusting cotton crop quotas has become law. A bill to expedite disposal of surplus farm commodities is scheduled for a House vote next week.

Housing — A general housing bill stripped of the administration's low-cost public housing program has passed the House but the Senate has restored most of the President's program. The bill is before a Senate-House conference committee.

National debt — The House has passed a bill to increase the national debt limit from 275 billion dollars to 290 billion but the Senate has not acted upon it.

Constitutional amendments — The Senate has defeated proposed amendments to limit the President's treaty powers and lower the voting age to 18.

**Wisconsin GOP  
Lauds McCarthy**

MILWAUKEE (AP)—A resolution praising Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis) was passed by a rousing voice vote Saturday at his home state Republican convention after an attack on the senator was stifled by boos, catcalls and stamping feet.

"Examination shows there is neither honesty, integrity or decency in the record of the junior senator from Wisconsin," Harold Michael of Amery shouted into

the convention floor microphone above the din.

Michael, Polk County GOP chairman and president of the Joe Must Go Club of Wisconsin, said, "The future of the Republican party must be our primary concern. McCarthy is certainly not concerned with the welfare of the Republican party."

The convention chairman, Rep. Laird (R-Wis) pounded furiously with his gavel for order but the delegates booing Michael paid no attention.

**CAN'T CODDLE HIM**

"McCarthy is the one who is spreading disunity within our party — pitting Republicans against Republicans," Michael declared. "He is the one who is following the Communist line of divide and conquer. We, as a party, cannot afford to coddle McCarthy any more than we can afford to coddle Communists and by passing this resolution we are doing just that."

The Joe Must Go club failed in a recent drive for enough signatures on petitions to force McCarthy to submit to a recall election.

The resolution, which lauded McCarthy in his campaign against Communists in government, was passed with a roar of voices after Michael's attack.

In a preceding resolution the 4,000 delegates sided with McCarthy against President Eisenhower on the question of giving legislative committee details on top level administrative conferences.

**STILL FOR IKE**

Eisenhower has ordered that no details of such a conference concerning McCarthy's row with the Army be given to the Senate investigations subcommittee conducting a hearing on the row. McCarthy said he thought the President should review that order and Saturday's resolution echoed that belief.

The Wisconsin GOP convention, however, also adopted a resolution praising the Eisenhower administration in general.

McCarthy later told a cheering audience that "with a clear conscience" he would work for Eisenhower's reelection if the President were running for reelection today.

"I don't care if we have a Democrat or Republican in the President's chair," McCarthy went on. "If I am to do my duty to the people of my state I can't be a rubber stamp even if it involves the flesh of the Republican party, which I think is the greatest in the world."

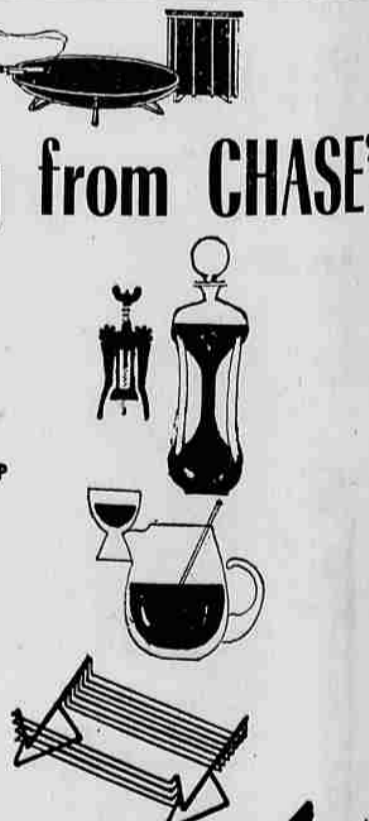
