

Citizens Asked To Display Flag

Residents of the Eugene area have been urged to observe Flag Week on June 14 by displaying flags in front of their homes and places of business.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower has referred to Flag Week as a time for thoughtful rededication to the values of freedom.

A local opportunity for such rededication will be offered by Eugene Lodge 357 of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. It will be a Flag Day ceremony June 16 at 8 p.m. at the Elks Temple. The public is invited.

JONES TO SPEAK

Participating in the ceremony will be the Elks band, many Elk members, and others. Dr. William C. Jones, executive director of the Western States Commission for Higher Education with offices in Eugene, will give the patriotic address.

The history of the flag will be detailed by Delmar Newman, assisted by local Scout organizations.

Using the slogan, "Show Your Colors," the Eugene Elks Lodge will conduct a brisk campaign for a community-wide flag display on June 14. The day will be in honor of the 177th anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777.

The Elks campaign is being conducted as part of a nationwide activity by 1,675 lodges of the Order of Elks. The Elks have observed the day since 1907.

MARINES MISSING

"We think that these times call for some good old-fashioned flag-waving," Bev Marlatt, exalted ruler of the lodge in Eugene said this week.

Also urging local participation in Flag Day are members of the Eugene Marine Corps Organized Reserve unit. Maj. Gene Williams is commanding officer of the unit.

The Marines unit will not be able to take part in the local ceremonies because members are at summer training camp in Coronado, Calif.

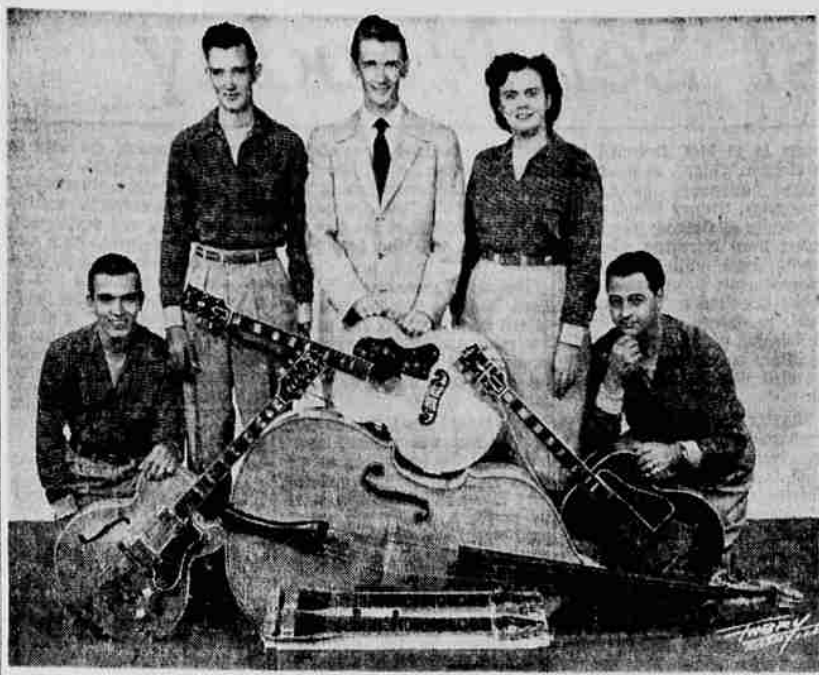

State Police Seek Suspect

CORVALLIS — A widespread hunt was ordered in Benton and Linn counties today in an attempt to apprehend an Arizona man believed to be the leader of a theft ring in Corvallis and Eugene.

SEALS OWN CAR

Donald M. Smith, 22, from Corvallis, Ariz., escaped from Corvallis police earlier this week but sped back into town last night, taking his own car from the parking area next to the police station, a police blockade at Sweet Home, crashed head-on into a car at Sweet Home, and then escaped a brushy area.

State police pursued Smith at speeds up to 90 miles an hour after he had taken his car in Corvallis.

DEATHS AFTER CRASH

He crashed through the blockade without slackening speed at Sweet Home, knocked out two cars on the highway divider and headed down a one-way street the wrong way, crashing head-on into an oncoming car. No one was injured in the collision. Smith fled from his car and escaped into dense brush.

He is believed to be the leader of a gang of three girls and a 16-year-old boy accused of several thefts in Corvallis and Eugene.

Months Over-Celebrate; Picked Up by Police

Four Eugene High School boys, celebrating their graduation Friday night, were arrested by city police following an orange juice and vodka party.

Police reported that a 1947 model sedan in which they were driving around town was stopped by an officer in the Fairmount area about three hours after commencement exercises at EHS.

The driver of the car had not been drinking, and no complaint was filed against him, police said. Their case was dismissed in municipal court Saturday morning.

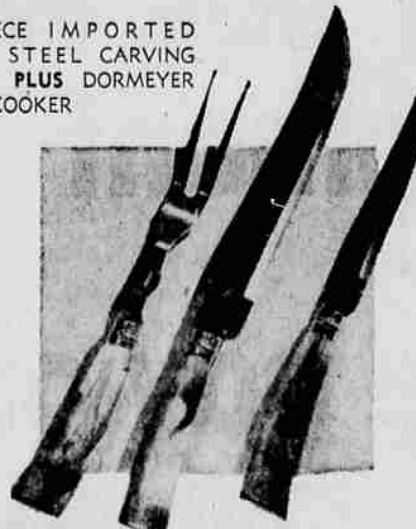

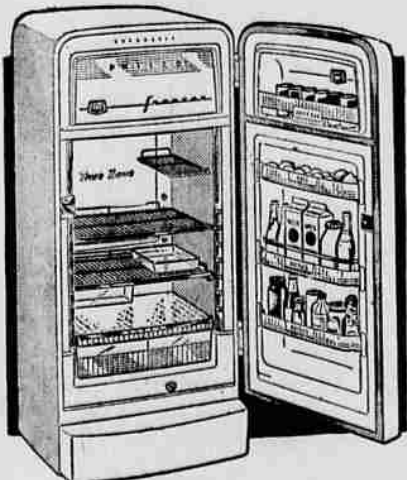
