

Democrats Cool To Ouster Move

WASHINGTON (AP) — A hands-off policy adopted by the Senate Democratic leadership Monday apparently all but doomed a move by Sen. Flanders (R-Vt.) to strip Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) of his investigating chairmanships.

Sen. Knowland of California, the Republican leader, has already made it abundantly clear that—as a representative of the GOP administration—he does not want to move against McCarthy in the way Flanders suggested on the floor of the Senate last Friday.

However, a remaining key factor, in a Senate where Democrats actually outnumber Republicans 48-47, was the attitude to be taken by members of the minority party.

While Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, the Democratic leader, would make no public statement on the issue, he was reliably reported Monday to have told party colleagues he regards McCarthy as a "Republican problem."

A question and answer session following the panel discussion brought out some of the most interesting views:

• An Oklahoman said that in his state the legislature had passed a law permitting cities to zone areas up to five miles outside the city limits to protect the development of urban areas. He also said that many cities forestall development of unincorporated areas adjacent to incorporated areas by charging as much as a 50 per cent surcharge for utilities, plus the additional cost of installation.

• It would seem from remarks made that one of the big problems in the San Francisco Bay area is that industry is moving in too fast. In Santa Clara they are now zoning land exclusively for agricultural use.

The program Monday included a discussion of how cities can attract industries and a panel on zoning for industrial use.

Other Oregon cities with representatives at the conference are Salem, Tillamook, McMinnville and Portland.

Chemist Raps AEC Decision

Oppenheimer Verdict Held Unscientific

PORTLAND (AP)—Linus Pauling, internationally known chemist, Sunday criticized the recent security dismissal of Atom Scientist J. Robert Oppenheimer.

Speaking at the Reed College commencement here, Pauling said the security board's refusal to clear Oppenheimer for access to classified government documents was an example of what he called unscientific thinking.

Pauling, who was born in Portland and who now teaches at the California Institute of Technology, commended Ward V. Evans, the only scientist on the security board, for his minority report on Oppenheimer.

'DEEPLY CONCERNED'

"I am deeply concerned by the lack of clear thinking shown in the report by Gordon Gray and Thomas A. Morgan (the other two members of the board). If it were not for the fact that I discern in the statements and actions of many of our leaders in Washington a similar inability to think clearly, I would say that the people who appointed the committee had just had bad luck in their appointments. I fear that in fact the ability to think clearly about great problems is a rare one in our national leaders—that there are not many men in public life who really know how to apply the scientific method."

Pauling called for more "scientific" thinking on political problems. He described this as a "search for truth."

"The truth does not depend upon the point of view—if your neighbor does not see things as you do, then you must search for the truth. If a statement is made in one country but not in another—then you must search for the truth," he said.

PRAISES MORSE

Pauling said there are few political leaders who have "the ability to think logically, thoroughly and straightforwardly, who are clearheaded and honest and who have the courage of their convictions." Among these few, he said, is Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon.

Pauling himself was the target of loyalty charges two years ago. He was named by ex-Communist Leader Louis Budenz as having once been a member of the Communist Party. Pauling has denied the charge in a sworn affidavit. At the commencement exercises, degrees were conferred by Reed President Duncan S. Balantine on 75 graduates. Among them was Pauling's daughter, Linda.
