Recess Expected In Geneva Talks

GENEVA (AP) — Western diplomats made plans Wednesday for a stand-by group to remain in Geneva during the expected suspension of the Indochina peace talks.

An authoritative source said some sort of a recess in the nine-power parley probably will be agreed on before the end of the week, but that there is no thought now of a complete break off of the talks.

France reportedly is opposed to any outright adjournment of the negotiations with the Communists, at least until after a new government has been set up in Paris and the National Assembly has had a chance to review the Indochina situation.

The United States and Britain were understood to be in agreement that France should not be deserted. They also feel the military talks here between the Vietminh and the French must continue.

Forest Service Post Assigned in Eugene

SALEM (AP) — State Forester George Spaur said Tuesday that E. Douglas Cruickshank has been assigned as technical assistant in the timber sales section at Eugene.

Cruickshank, who spent five years in the Royal Air Force and Royal Navy air arm, is a 1953 graduate of the state college of forestry at Syracuse University, New York.

Born in London, he completed his education in the United States after obtaining his citizenship at the end of World War II.

French Foreign Minister Georges Bidault flew back from Paris Wednesday to discuss the situation with British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden and U.S. Under Secretary of State Walter Bedell Smith at a dinner Wednesday night.

Smith and Eden also saw Jean Chauvel, French ambassador to Switzerland, on the situation Wednesday morning. Eden planned to meet later Wednesday with Communist China's Premier-Foreign Minister Chou En-lai.

One plan reportedly being considered by the West would have each of the nine delegations leave in Geneva responsible—but not top-level representatives to serve as a stand-by group.

This would permit quick resumption of the full conference should developments warrant it.

A high Western source said the French-Vietminh military talks had made very little progress so far on their task of defining cease-fire lines. He said, however, they had exchanged maps giving their initial ideas of where the two rival forces should be assembled.

This source said that in the initial exchange both sides "claimed everything." He acknowledged that this was usual in the first stages of bargaining, but that in this case events in Indochina might be the deciding factor.

The United States was reported still firmly opposed to any move to divide Indochina into two zones. The feeling in U.S. circles is that this would mean permanent partition of Indochina. The United States and France were understood to be pressing for a series of "goose egg" areas where the troops would be assembled after an armistice.

General Glad Of Talks' End

'No Surprise,' Says Van Fleet of Geneva

TOKYO (AP) — Gen. James A. Van Fleet, former commander of the U. S. 8th Army in Korea, said the breakup of the Korean peace conference at Geneva was "no surprise to me" and "I'm glad it finally came about."

The retired general, on a military aid survey of the Far East for President Eisenhower, declared, "We had to go through with it and prove once again you can't believe the Communists—you can't rely on them."

Van Fleet arrived today from Korea and said he planned to visit Formosa "as soon as I can."

Earlier, at Seoul airport, Van Fleet told newsmen South Korea has more than enough men to expand its army above 20 divisions.

Informed quarters said it appeared that President Eisenhower has been using Van Fleet—a personal friend of stubborn old President Syngman Rhee—to keep South Korea in line since the Geneva talks failed.

Rhee has said frequently since the armistice was signed last July that he would order a drive north if Korea was not united peacefully.

At Chinhae, where Rhee is attending an unofficial Asian anti-Communist conference, the fiery President said breakup of the Geneva talks "is the first time since the cease-fire talks began in Panmunjom that the United States has led the other nations in withdrawing from a conference with the Communists."

The ROK President said calling off the peace conference demonstrates that "the free nations no longer are begging the Communists to come to some agreement so as to avoid at any cost the possibility of World War III."

Higher Rates for Some Sewage Disposal

CHICAGO (AP) — Some cities have set higher rates for industries which dispose of sewage containing highly concentrated chemicals.

The American Public Works Association said such wastes are more costly to treat.

C.; Rush, Westlake, Corpus Christi and Texas City, Tex.; Winchester, Va.; and Madison and Shawano, Wis.

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Coloradan Nominated As Member of ICC

WASHINGTON (AP) — John H. Winchell of Denver, chairman of the Colorado Utilities Commission, was nominated Tuesday by President Eisenhower as a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission. The jobs pays \$15,000 a year.

Winchell, a former assistant attorney general of Colorado, is 61 and a mining engineer as well as lawyer. His term will expire Dec. 31, 1960.

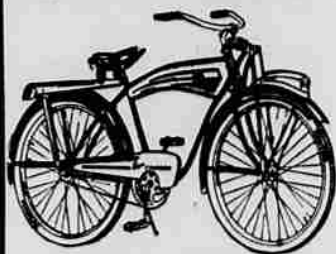
Winchell succeeds James K. Knudson, whose term ended last Dec. 31. Knudson stayed on until recently, however.

FT. HOOD, Tex. (AP) — The 4th Armored Division, which fought through France and into Czechoslovakia in World War II, was reactivated here Tuesday.

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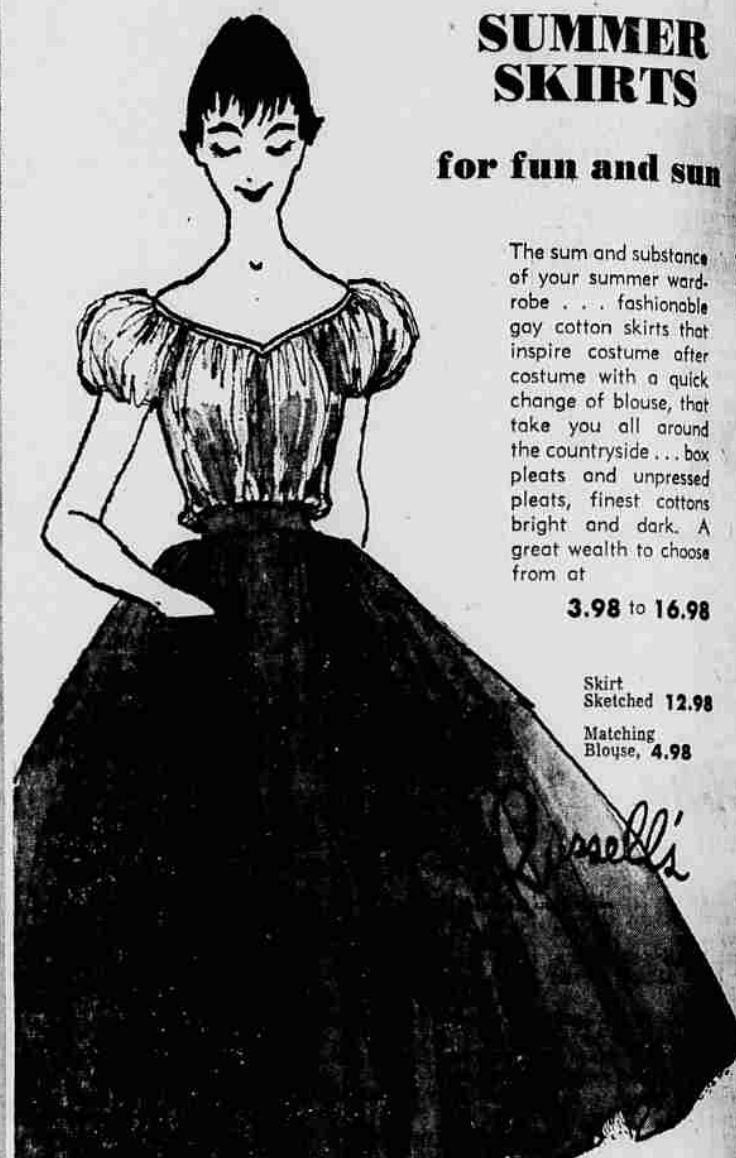
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
