

Vacation Bible Schools Show Daily Increases

Every Daily Vacation Bible School (DVBS) superintendent reports a day to day increase in enrollment with one telling of a growth of from 50 to 133 in four days. A farewell party with the invitation to the whole community is being planned at the Church of God in honor of the Rev. and Mrs. Herbert Sackett, who are leaving Springfield after ten years. He is the oldest pastor in point of service in Springfield and the denomination in the state of Oregon. They will soon to work and live in Los Angeles, Washington.

Friday the 25th will be the end of DVBS which began with 148 children. Displays and a program will proceed open house and refreshments.

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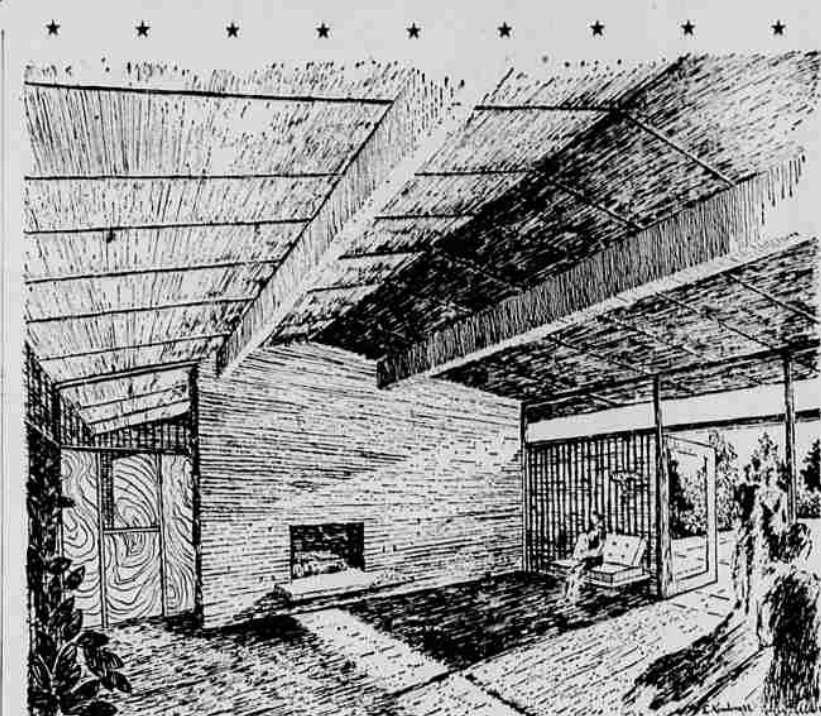
