

Reed Faculty To Decide On Red Issue

PORTLAND (AP)—The faculty council at Reed College will hold a hearing to determine whether there should be disciplining of three faculty members, named at a Velde Committee hearing, as one-time Communist party members.

The three are Lloyd J. Reynolds, art professor; Leonard Marsak, professor of history and humanities, and Stanley W. Moore, professor of philosophy.

Reynolds already has been removed from the summer teaching schedule although Reed president, Duncan S. Ballantine, said Tuesday this should not be regarded as suspension from the faculty.

Reynolds and Marsak refused on constitutional grounds, to testify before the House Un-American Activities Committee of which Rep. Velde (R-Ill.) is chairman, here last week. Moore had meeting of the committee in Washington earlier. Moore now is on leave from the college for study in the east.

Ballantine said the faculty council would begin this week working out standards and procedures, then would invite the three men to appear before it.

Second Blue Book Issue Eyed

SALEM (AP)—Whether the secretary of state's office will be required to publish a second Oregon Blue Book this biennium will be settled Friday when the State Emergency Board receives a request for \$12,000 to pay for it.

The last Legislature passed a bill sponsored by Reps. Monroe Sweetland of Milwaukie and David Baum of La Grande, providing that the Blue Book, the state's official reference guide, be published as the Legislature convenes instead of after it has adjourned.

The law making the change went into effect this year, so the secretary of state's office was required to produce a book after the Legislature met in 1953. It was not distributed until January of this year. Now, under the new law, another one is required before the Legislature meets next January.

William Healy, assistant secretary of state, who is responsible for the book, is expected to protest the production of the second one, pointing out the difficulty of assembling the printing the necessary information in the interval between the November election and the opening of the Legislature.

Rep. Baum, sponsor of the plan, is a member of the Emergency Board.

adjourned. The book always has been over a year old when the Legislature meets in January and has not contained the names of federal, state, county and city officials elected the previous November.

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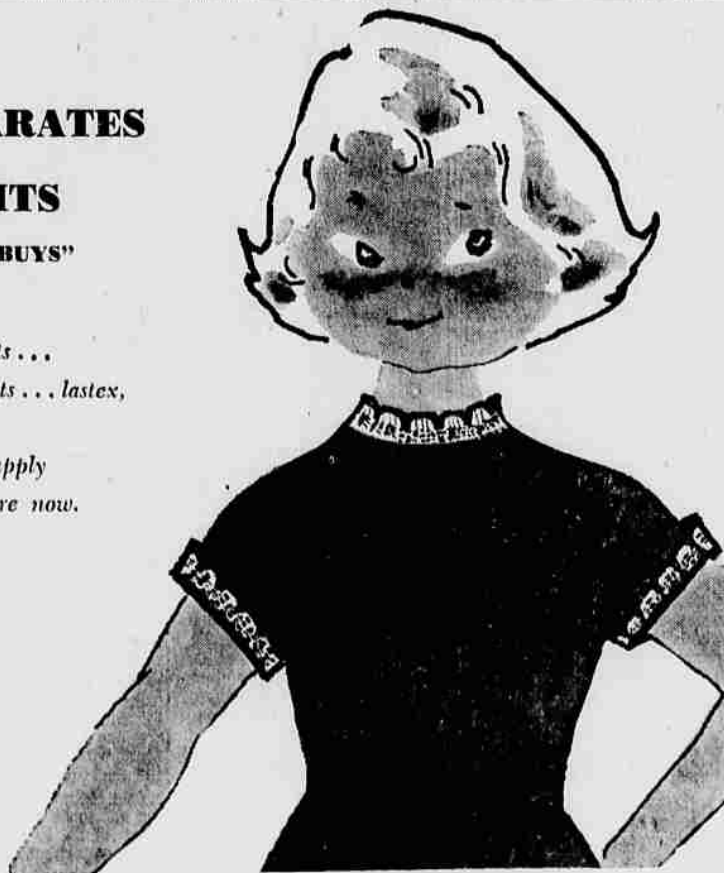
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
