Michigan Convict Killed in Rioting

PONTIAC, Ill. (AP)—One convict was killed Wednesday night when 450 prisoners at the Pontiac State Penitentiary staged a two-hour riot that was quelled by prison guards with three barages of tear gas.

The victim, Edwin Jenkins, 21, of Chicago, was fatally wounded in the back of the head. Vernon Von Qualen, Livingston County coroner, said a preliminary autopsy report showed Jenkins was killed by a "high speed projectile." Prison officials said guards

Ike Opposes Hiss Pension

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two federal agencies scrambled Thursday to get into line behind President Eisenhower in opposing a government pension for Alger Hiss.

The Budget Bureau and Civil Service Commission this week took issue with various bills aimed at denying retirement payments to Hiss and any other government employee convicted of a felony involving the misuse of authority.

Rep. Kit Clardy (R-Mich.), sponsor of one of the measures, said he was "shocked" and "boiling mad" at their stand since Hiss, a former State Department official, was convicted of perjury for denying he passed secrets to the Communists.

The White House then announced late Wednesday that Eisenhower feels Hiss should not receive a federal pension, that all government agencies should follow the Army retirement plan under which pensions are paid only for honorable service.

The bureau and commission promptly issued statements declaring they, too, are not opposed to denying pension payments to Hiss or other felons as long as it is "under a valid statute" or legislation that is "constitutional."

Rep. Albert W. Cretella (R-Conn.), chairman of a Civil Service subcommittee, said his group will approve some measure stripping felons of pension rights since there is "overwhelming sentiment that traitors to their government shall not profit at its expense."

Jurors Indict Ex-Girl Friend Of Gangster

LOS ANGELES (AP)—An indictment charging income tax evasion has been returned against Virginia Hill, 39, onetime girl friend of the slain gangster, Bugsy Siegel, but there appears little the government can do if she remains out of this country.

A federal grand jury indicted the statuesque brunette Wednesday on charges of evading \$80,380.02 in taxes for the years 1944 through 1947.

It was in June, 1947, that Siegel was shot to death in a luxurious home Miss Hill rented in Beverly Hills. She was in Paris at the time and the slaying never was solved.

In 1950, Miss Hill married Hans Hauser, an Austrian-born ski instructor, and they have been living at Kloster, Switzerland, and are now at Salzburg, Austria. He is her fourth husband.

A deputy U.S. attorney said income tax evasion is not an extraditable offense and Miss Hill cannot be prosecuted as long as she remains outside the United States.

The Internal Revenue Bureau in 1951 claimed she owed \$161,000 in back income taxes and her \$35,000 home in Spokane, Wash., and other possessions were auctioned off to satisfy part of that claim.

Call Clears Up Kidnap Case

Boy Disappeared 42 Years Ago

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP)—A kidnap mystery dating back 42 years apparently was solved Thursday by a telephone call from the victim now living in West Virginia.

Robert Thompson was only three years old when his father took him from the home of his mother here in 1912, a short time after his parents were divorced, and custody of their son given to the mother.

He was the object of a nationwide search at the time, but no trace of the child or his father ever was found.

FINDS CLIPPINGS

The mystery was broken Wednesday night when Springfield police received a telephone call from a man who identified himself as Robert Wilson Pitman, 45, of Japonica Land, Woodrum Park, Charleston, W.Va.

"Pitman" told police that his father, whom he had known as "Wilson Ambrose Pitman," died recently, and that he learned of his true name and past history from newspaper clippings and other papers he found in his father's effects.

The West Virginia man reported that his father assumed the name of Pitman right after the abduction, and that until his father died, he thought that was his real name.

MOTHER IN HOSPITAL

He telephoned police to ask them if his mother, Mrs. Rose Ethel Mason Thompson still was living.

Police located an aunt, Mrs. Ruth Rawson, who said that the kidnaped boy's mother, now Mrs. Rose Tracy, of Jericho Center, Vt., is in a hospital at Burlington, Vt., following an eye operation.

Police said the West Virginia man said he will come here and go to Burlington to see his mother he never knew.

He is married and the father of two children, police said.

Cornell Prof. Debunks Vitaminizing Milk

ITHACA, N. Y. (AP)—Dr. L. A. Maynard, professor of biochemistry at Cornell University, says the addition of vitamins to milk tends to obscure its basic values.

"This country's food supplies already offer more than enough of the nutrients to keep our population healthy," he said.

He added that since most people who suffer from deficiencies in vitamins are in the low-income bracket, the higher cost of fortified milk "might lead to their consuming less of it."

He also criticized processors who want to add vitamins to their milk because they think it will increase their market, inasmuch as the public is now very "vitamin-conscious."

Number of Unwed Mothers Increasing

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The number of unwed mothers is increasing—especially among teenagers or upper class girls—and a "sex hysteria" in American society is partly to blame, a physician said Wednesday.

Many influences are at work producing "an emotional shambles which fosters many of the deviations and denatured biological trends which are common among our young folks," Dr. Goodrich C. Schauffer of Portland, Ore., told then American Medical Assn.

NEED DOCTORS' HELP

He urged physicians to "go beyond the ordinary call" of duty to help these girls.

He said he had seen "too many impressively happy endings" to think these matters cannot be "decently handled — many of them by the physician."

Having their babies may "turn out to be a maturing experience — often a distinct psychological advantage as compared to an abortion."

Dr. Schauffer said there were 88,000 illegitimate live births in 1938, and 142,000 in 1950. Nearly half these mothers in 1950 were under 20, and 32,000 were girls under 17.

"A much higher percentage of unmarried mothers nowadays comes from comparatively privileged groups—high school students, college students, young women with good jobs, as compared with the 'poor working girl' or 'penniless domestic' of the beginning of the century."

Modern customs which "precipitate precocious sex activity of young people" are one cause, Dr. Schauffer said.

GANG INFLUENCES

Young people are more aware of sex, "stimulated and maintained by the sex hysteria which is a calculated instrument of modern journalism and so-called entertainment trends."
