

Colons Naming Lakes Again

Coon Undecided
On Compromise

WASHINGTON (AP) — Wash-
ington and Oregon Congressional
delegations are name calling
about those dams.

It all started last year when
Rep. Holmes (R-Wash.) intro-
duced a bill to designate the
reservoir to be formed behind
the dam as Lake Wallula, to
commemorate the Washington town
which would be inundated by the
dam.

WINTER PROPOSAL

Rep. Coon (R-Ore), from the
other side of the Columbia River
boundary, countered promptly.
He proposed the artificial lake be
called Lake Umatilla—an Indian
name associated with Oregon his-

tory. Mack (R-Wash), whose
control subcommittee was
called upon to approve one or
the other, refused to get involv-
ed. He said to refer it back to
the region for agreement on a
single name.

Holmes now has come up with
a name that could be a compromise
but has withheld agreement.

Holmes has introduced a reso-
lution to give names to three
reservoirs. That behind McNary
would be called Lake Wal-
lula, but those who hold out for
Wallula would get that name for
the lake behind John Day Dam.
Wallula is still in the planning
stage.

LAKE CELILO

The impounded water of The
Celilo Dam would be called Lake
Celilo to commemorate the famed
Indian fishing site at Celilo Falls.
The site would be leveled out by
the flooding waters.

Holmes said the new proposal
for the support of his area and
that he even has letters from
some cross-river Oregonians
pleading with the Lake Wallula des-
ignation for McNary.

Coon still isn't convinced. He
said, however, that he's with-
holding judgment on the new
proposal until he's heard from
his constituents.

EDC Without France, Italy Not a Practical Proposal

The idea produced in Congress
that West Germany, Holland,
Luxembourg and Belgium should
form a defense community of
their own without France and
Italy can hardly mean anything
concrete, being merely pressure
on the recalcitrants.

The House Foreign Affairs Com-
mittee has voted that no new
arms shipments be authorized
for France and Italy, unless they
ratify the European Defense
Community. The four countries
which have ratified EDC can get
them if they will form some new
organization among themselves.

THIRD FORCE

That means starting arms
shipments to Germany and would
produce the complete alienation
of French public and parliamen-
tary opinion. France would not
even permit arms to go into her
occupation zone in Germany. She
would feel that a third force is
being created in Europe which
is more dangerous to her than
Russia. No amount of supra-
national control of a joint army
by the four countries under the
North Atlantic Treaty Organiza-
tion would satisfy France, for
such controls would never be
even as strong as under the Eu-
ropean Defense Community plan
which France originated but now
fears to adopt.

There can be no doubt that
France would veto the admission
of such an army into NATO. The
three small powers already are
members. But no other plan ex-
cept some form of EDC can pos-
sibly get French acceptance of
German rearmament.

RAISES QUESTION

There is no question that the
United States has the right to say
how its arms shall be used and
under what system. But there is
a question whether coercion is in
her own interest.

The French government is in
no position to force the EDC is-

sue in Parliament right now. The
idea that she is driven into action
by the United States may serve to
further solidify the opposition
just at a time when the govern-
ment, had it not been slapped
down over the Indochina matter,
seemed assured of enough votes
for EDC.

Italy is a different case. Italy,
taking advantage of French slow-
ness, is withholding approval of
EDC in an attempt to lever a
Trieste settlement in her own
favor. The argument, of course, is
that she can't turn her army over

to supranational control as long
as there is a possibility that she
might have to fight Yugoslavia to
protect her interests at the head
of the Adriatic.

RELUCTANT ALLY

The prospect is that Italy,
rather than have military aid cut
off, would agree to some arrange-
ment with Germany, Belgium,
Luxembourg and Holland.

But the idea of a defense of
Western Europe without France
is too difficult to contemplate. It
could only lay the basis for an-
other rescue operation.

What the United States is actu-
ally doing is threatening to make
France a third-rate power unless
she goes ahead with EDC. The
pressure may force her to do so.
But, being forced now, she may
become a very reluctant ally.

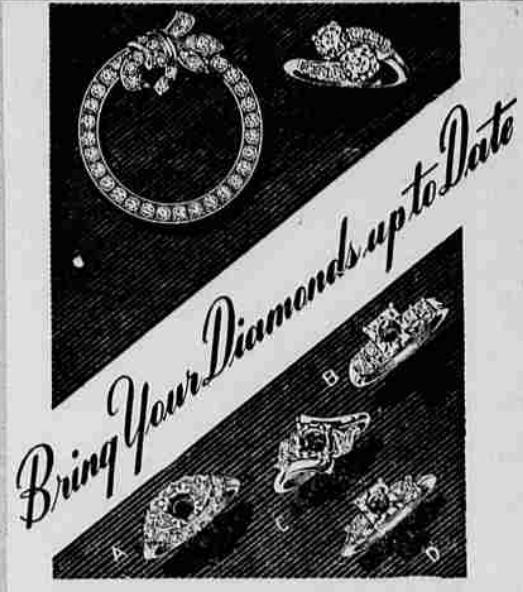
It is unfortunate that the
American decision had to be
made now, during the course of
consideration of the annual
money bills, instead of giving
France a little time after her gov-
ernment is once again effective.
She was very close to voluntary
ratification before the present
crisis.

here."



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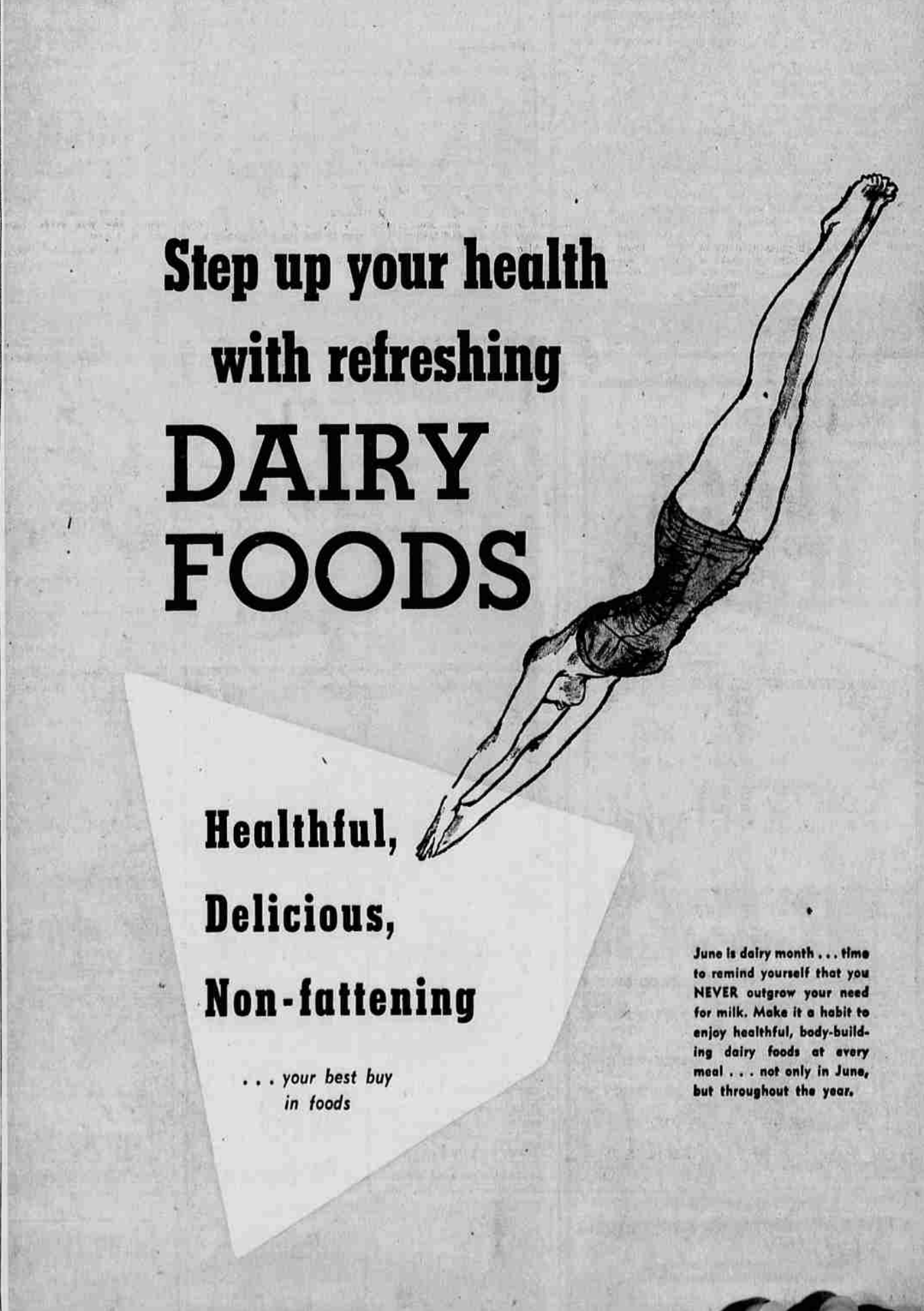
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
