Every-Member Training Union Basic in Southern Baptist Plan

Perhaps every church faces an increasing demand for more better trained leaders. This has led Southern Baptist churches to establish "Training Union" which meets on Sunday mornings preceding the evening worship service. It gives opportunities for service for each member by taking parts on programs or serving as officers, by the study of doctrine and the whole program of the church.

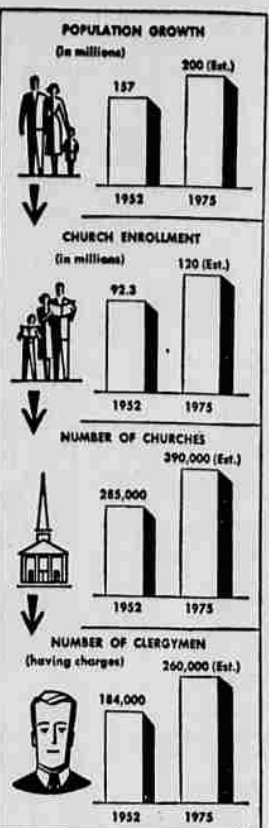
The Training Union encourages the daily reading of the Bible on the part of each member, and promotes the study of the practical of Christian living and service, such as "Training in Church Membership," "The Grace of Giving," "How to Win to Christ," and "Building a Christian Home." The support of the church through tithes and offerings, and by attending the worship services is a major part of the work of the Training Union.

Southern Baptist churches endeavor to have a Department of the Training Union to correspond to each department of their Sunday School. For example, there are Beginner, Primary, Junior, Intermediate, Young Peoples, and Adult Departments. There may be only one Union in each department or there may be several, depending on the number enrolled. The plan is to have unions of the size that enables each member to have definite responsibilities, as it is this which makes the work of the Training Union effective by giving the members opportunity to express themselves, to overcome shyness, and to learn skills and uncover talents.

In the departments for young children, the work of the Training Union is much the same as that of the Sunday School; that is, providing a happy atmosphere, giving opportunities for worship experiences, and imparting facts concerning spiritual matters within the grasp of the age group. In the departments for Adults and older children who are church members, the work seeks to show the responsibility of the individual to his church and to develop well-rounded Christians.

The Training Union differs from the Sunday School in that there are no "teachers." The younger departments have leaders who help the boys and girls who are officers, and the Adult Departments have Presidents, Group Captains (program committee), Bible Reader's Leaders, and various other officers necessary for the carrying on of the work of the people who have united themselves for training.

Another difference from Sunday School is that the boys and girls, or men and women, meet together, thus providing an opportunity for them to learn to work and worship together.

Doolittle Raiders Vote To Aid Missionary Work

GALVESTON, Tex.—Survivors of General Jimmy Doolittle's raid on Tokyo in 1942 voted at their annual meeting here to send part of the group's treasury to one of their members, now a missionary in Japan.

The Rev. Jacob DeShazer of Madras, Ore., formerly of Creswell, Ore., pastor of a Free Methodist Church in Tokyo, was a bombardier and tailgunner with the rank of corporal on the last of 16 twin-engine B-25's that took off from the aircraft carrier Hornet for the bombing attack on the Japanese capital, April 18, 1942.

One of the 10 men in the two planes brought down in Japan, he spent 40 months in prison—34 of them in solitary confinement—and was returned to America with three other survivors at the end of the war.

During his imprisonment, DeShazer obtained a Bible from a guard and read it through many times. It was this, he said, which made him dedicate his life to the ministry.

Southern Baptists have a system of teacher training which is recognized by leaders of many denominations as among the best. The basis of this training is the weekly meeting of teachers and officers in which plans are made, problems discussed, and the lesson for the coming Sunday is studied. Also, there is a system of study by which the teachers earn diplomas and seals for the study of certain books from a series of more than 130 books. These deal with "the Bible"; "Administration of the Sunday School"; "The Art of Teaching"; "Doctrines and Evangelism"; "The Work of the Various Departments"; and "Special Studies," such as music, library, church buildings, visitation, the "Vacation Bible School"; and "Preview Studies" of lessons to be studied in the next quarter.

Southern Baptists do not consider the Sunday school as something added to or apart from the church; but rather it is considered to be "the Church Organized for Bible Study." As such the Sunday school is a vital part of church life and the means by which the church grows and is strengthened.

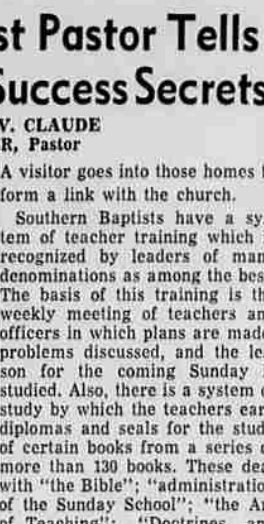

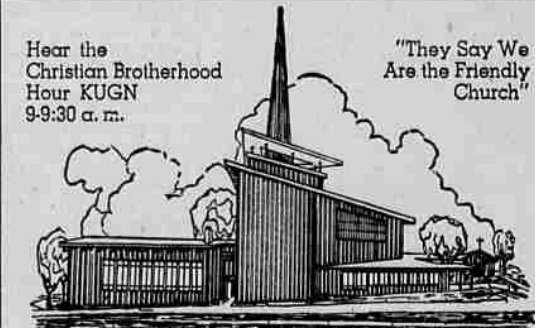
