

Viet Nam Premier To Demand All Of Delta Area

SAIGON, Indochina (AP)— Viet Nam Premier Ngo Dinh Diem said Wednesday he could not accept the French withdrawal from the southern Red River delta as final. He said he would demand it be returned to his government's control.

There was no likelihood the French would or could meet Diem's demand for reoccupation of the 2,000-square miles of the southern delta, from which French Union forces withdrew last week.

The French said the withdrawal was necessary to strengthen the defenses of Hanoi, Haiphong and the highway and railway linking them. The Communist-led Vietminh moved into the abandoned area, populated by some two million people, as soon as the French moved out.

But Diem's statement, made in an address on his inauguration Wednesday as Viet Nam premier, underlined his opposition to the partition of his country which most Vietnamese fear is now being worked out at the Geneva conference.

State to Skirt U. S. Decision On Segregation

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)—The bulk of Louisiana's program to skirt the U. S. Supreme Court decision on school segregation went to the governor Wednesday after taking on amendments to satisfy objections raised by the Catholic Church.

The Senate Tuesday gave final legislative passage to a constitutional amendment and two bills enabling Louisiana to use its inherent police power to continue separate white and Negro schools and directing parish (county) superintendents to assign children in advance of a school term.

The constitutional amendment will be submitted to voters for approval in a November general election. The others become law with Gov. Robert Kennon's signature.

Kennon, who has said that Louisiana would continue to have segregation, previously indicated he would sign the legislation.

Reference to parochial and private schools were deleted from all three measures after the Catholic archdiocese of New Orleans protested the danger of government encroachment on their school system.

Junta Lifts State of Siege Imposed by Ousted Arbenz

GUATEMALA (AP)— Guatemala's new military government Tuesday night lifted the state of siege proclaimed by ousted President Jacobo Arbenz Guzman.

Pushing ahead with its anti-Communist, back-to-normal program, the ruling five-man junta also:

- Barred all illiterates—an estimated 65 per cent of the country's three million population—from voting;
- Froze the assets of Arbenz, ex-Foreign Minister Guillermo Toriello and other persons prominent under the former Communist-backed government;
- Continued the roundup of suspected Reds;
- Announced restrictions on civil rights would continue in effect until Aug. 8. However, the junta has already ended the Arbenz-imposed strict censorship of the local and foreign press.

The ban on voting by illiterates struck at wide support which the Communists have whipped up among the uneducated peasantry. Under the 1945 Constitution which ex-President Juan Jose Arevalo and Arbenz sponsored, all men—literate and illiterate—over 18 and all literate women of that age could vote.

The new junta degree limited balloting to those able to read and write.

Jury Resumes Thorne Probe

CHICAGO (AP)—The possibility that Montgomery Ward Thorne was poisoned confronted a coroner's jury Wednesday as it resumed its investigation of the death of the 20-year-old heir to a multimillion-dollar mail order fortune.

Dr. Harry Leon, coroner's pathologist, testifying at Tuesday's inquest, said he thinks Thorne may have been poisoned.

"This is still a suspicious death," he said.

Leon read a report to Coroner Walter T. McCarron by Dr. W. J. R. Camp, state toxicologist, showing an "insignificant trace quantity of barbiturate, a trace quantity of alkaloid giving color reactions indicating morphine" were found in the youth's brain.

A combination of enough alcohols such as were found in Thorne's body and more dope could have caused his death, Dr. Leon declared. The alcohol, he said, may have evaporated or been dissipated in the body before the autopsy was performed.
