

Arson Ruse Leads to Jail

WOOD RIVER (AP)—Three men charged with setting a fire on the night of July 15, appeared before Circuit Judge Malcolm Wilkinson today in the first day of criminal sentencing in the county's courthouse.

Raymond Helland pleaded guilty to arson and to burglary and was sentenced to four years on each charge, the sentences to run concurrently.

Don Smith also pleaded guilty. Sentence was deferred. Bert Hall pleaded innocent and will be tried.

Last month a set fire on the night attracted police away from the downtown district one block and when they returned, a safe containing \$1,600 was missing.

The safe and the money were recovered and the three were arrested after a widespread search the next day south of the town.

Army Increases Enlistment Bonus

WASHINGTON (AP)—An Air Force sergeant completing a four-year hitch will be \$516 richer, a private first class \$372, for signing up for another four years for the new armed services enlistment bonus law.

The old law offered \$160 to military leaders said the bonus wasn't big enough to lure good men from being drained to civilian pursuits—especially in the higher grades where trained career men are a regular asset.

Springfield Asks Bids On New Fire Truck

Bids have been requested for a new all-purpose fire truck to retire one of the Springfield department's older trucks, Chief Harry Krieger said Friday.

The truck is to be a 500-gallon-a-minute tanker-pumper with a 1,000 gallon tank. The city budgeted \$10,000 for its purchase this year. Bids will be opened Aug. 9.

Krieger said the new truck will be useful in both house and grass fires and to carry salvage equipment. It will replace a 1934 tanker truck.

UO ROTC Cadets Win Tacoma Trophy

TACOMA (AP)—University of Oregon cadets have won the City of Tacoma trophy, presented to the outstanding unit at the Air Force ROTC summer camp at nearby McChord Air Force Base.

The trophy was presented Friday by Tacoma Mayor Harold M. Tollefson to Cadet Col. Charles H. Greenley, who won the "outstanding cadet" award. The ceremony was held in conjunction with the cadets' graduation after four weeks of training.

Red Troops Battle Flood in Hungary

VIENNA, Austria (AP)—Thousands of Communist troops were reported Saturday battling Hungary's worst flood disaster.

Reports from Budapest said the Gyser, a rail center of 80,000 population in northwest Hungary, also was flooded.

A major part of the city was said to have been evacuated.

The Danube has been rising by more than one foot a day at Budapest and the river was expected to reach the extremely dangerous level of 16.7 feet today. A part of the old "inner city" was reported already under water.

Portland to Study 1959 World's Fair

PORTLAND (AP)—The Portland Chamber of Commerce will make a study to decide whether Portland should stage a world's fair in 1959.

The chamber's board of directors Friday voted to go ahead with the study, which was proposed by the chamber's visitors service committee.

No estimate was made of how large such a fair might be, or what it might cost.

Groucho Marx, 59, Wed to 24-Year-Old

SUN VALLEY, Idaho (AP)—Groucho Marx, veteran Hollywood comedian, was married to Miss Eden Hartford, 24, Beverly Hills, Calif., in a private ceremony here Saturday afternoon.

The marriage, which had been rumored for the past several weeks, was delayed several hours when the party had to travel to Twin Falls, 80 miles from Sun Valley, to obtain a license.

Marx's 7-year-old daughter by a former marriage, Melinda, and Miss Hartford, a former resident of Salt Lake City, arrived in Sun Valley from Beverly Hills.

The ceremony was performed in a suite at the lodge of Justice of the Peace O. R. Hurt of Hailey, Idaho.

It was the third marriage for Marx, 59.
