Soil District Urges Study

A request that an integrated watershed study be made in the Long Tom and Coyote Creek districts was forwarded to the State Soil Conservation Office at Portland this week.

The request was adopted at Monday night's meeting of supervisors of the West Central Lane Soil Conservation District, Chairman Charles V. Liles reports.

The monthly session of the district's supervisors also resulted in drafting of a letter of appreciation for O. S. Fletcher, retiring Lane County extension agent.

William A. Potter was reappointed for another three-year term as a district supervisor at this meeting, following receipt of approval of his nomination from the State Soil Conservation Committee.

The meeting also brought reports that soil surveys in the month preceding had covered 7,000 acres, bring the total acreage surveyed to date to 36,000. It was further noted that engineering assistance on irrigation dam, drainage problems, ditch construction and similar undertakings was given to 22 farmers in the West Central Lane District during the month.

Petersen Joins Committee For Farmers' Loan Agency

Carl Petersen of Veneta has been appointed as a member of the Lane County Farmers Home Administration committee, William E. Walsh, the agency's county supervisor announced this week. The appointment became effective July 9.

Petersen operates a poultry farm as the major enterprise, but has carried on diversified operations in the past.

The other two members of the three-member committee are David J. Calvert, who operates a general farm with bean growing his major enterprise, and Charles B. Flanagan, who operates a general farm with dairying his major enterprise.

Each member is named for a three-year term, and one appointment expires each year. No member completing a three-year term can succeed himself.

Every agricultural county in the country has such a committee to help the Farmers Home Administration county supervisor adapt the agency's loan policies to local conditions including farm credit needs.

The Farmers Home Administration makes loans to family-type farm operators to buy, improve, or operate efficient farms,

or to construct or repair farm water facilities needed for profitable operation. However, the agency does not make loans of any type to any applicant whose needs can be handled by other credit sources.

Before any money can be borrowed through the agency, an applicant must have the approval of the county committee. In the case of a farm ownership loan, the farm to be purchased, enlarged, or improved must also be approved by the committee, the county supervisor explained.

Portland Man New Tarzan

HOLLYWOOD, Calif.—The new Tarzan of the films is Gordon Werschkul, 25, a native of Portland.

Werschkul, whose film name is Gordon Scott, was selected Tuesday by Producer Sol Lesser from a group of 15 contenders for the role.

Lesser offered the muscular young man a screen test after he was spotted in a newsreel shot at Las Vegas, Nev., hotel swimming pool where he was working as a life guard.

Werschkul becomes the 11th man to be cast as Tarzan since the first of the film series was cast in 1918.

Farm Safety Week Planned

Governor Paul Patterson, in a special proclamation, has called upon the people of Oregon to observe National Farm Safety Week, July 25-31. He urges "all farm residents to make every effort to develop safe work habits and skills, so they may 'Farm to Live and Live to Farm.'"

Observance of Farm Safety Week in Oregon, as planned by the Governor's Committee on Farm Safety, will include: The Governor's proclamation; special church observance on Sunday, July 25, to open the week; state and county publicity including radio programs; county observance planned and developed by local committees under the direction of County Agent W. B. Parker who has been named county chairman of Safety Week, in cooperation with the Grange, Farm Bureau, and Farmers Union and other local groups.

Al Bauer, farm service director of radio station KSLM, Salem, and state representative on the Governor's committee of the Oregon Broadcasters Assn., is chairman of the Governor's Committee on Farm Safety and was named chairman of Oregon's 1954-55 Farm Safety Week at a recent meeting in Portland.

Plans are to make Farm Safety Week a continuing program so that "every week will be a safety week."
