Parliament Backs Winnie On Suez Canal Agreement

LONDON (AP)—Parliament got ready to close shop for the summer recess Friday after according Prime Minister Churchill a 10-1 confidence vote on his plan to pull British troops from the Suez Canal zone. Most Laborites abstained on the ballot.

The House of Commons backed the prime minister's historic decision by a vote of 257-26 after Churchill made an impassioned declaration that the H-bomb had rendered the billion dollar, 75-year-old string of bases obsolete.

Both Commons and the House of Lords, which also debated the controversial Suez issue, begin their summer recess Friday. They will not reconvene until October.

The Suez agreement, which has strong U. S. support, calls for the transfer of 83,000 British troops from their Suez base within 20 months after a seven-year pact is signed.

The pact will give Britain the right to reoccupy the base in case of attack on Turkey or any of the eight Arab nations. Civilian caretakers under contract to Britain will keep up the great installation dominating the vital waterway.

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Dior's 'Flat Look' Emphasizes Hips

PARIS (AP)—Fashion designer Christian Dior, who popularized the postwar new look set out Thursday to do it again with a fall and winter line that denies feminine curves are where they used to be.

Dior's mannequins appeared as if they were ready for a big night back in the roaring '20s. They had flattened busts, waistslines where you might expect hips and hardly a natural curve in the house.

LOUD APPLAUSE

If Dior's ideas win acceptance—and he drew loud applause at the showings—it will be pretty trying for women who lack the sleek figures of Dior's models.

He calls it his "H-line" because that is what the new form is supposed to resemble. It also might indicate "hips," because that is where the emphasis is. The few belts that appeared on the costumes were draped consistently at the hips.

Dior appears to have disregarded last year's unsuccessful attempt by former fashion empress Coco Chanel to stage a comeback with similar beanlike figures. His styles—flat, boyish, slender, elongated and long-waisted—go even farther.

MORE WEARABLE

"The Line," as fashion experts quickly dubbed it, looks less startling and more wearable in full flaring cocktail and dinner dresses.

One reassuring part of the changing fashion scene is the decision by Dior and other designers not to tinker with skirt lengths. They figure 17 inches from the floor is about right for hemlines.

PARIS (AP)—Dress designer Christian Dior's "Flat Look," with a special girdle to take the bounce out of bosoms, replaced politics Friday as the Frenchman's favorite topics.

Dior's bold effort to flatten the bustline forced a decision between native pride at producing a headliner and shame at fashioning a wall-flower.

"I'll miss it" (the bust), was the general reaction of the Parisian male.

ROAR OF PROTEST

A roar of protest went up from false manufacturers.

"How will a girl explain where it all went so suddenly," one manufacturer complained.

"This look will not have a large success with those who have something to show," predicted Jacques Mollin, the Minsky of Paris.

Most men in Paris refused to dignify Dior's whittling down of the female form.

"We've been fooled before," some said.

"Yes, and we'll be fooled again," a sidewalk cafe owner said. "This tampering with nature is not an endless process. One of these days the slogan of the male revolt against such
