Only one week remains until the beginning of the Rosell United Church Crusade at the Eugene High School auditorium, Sunday, Aug. 8. The Crusade will begin with a 2:30 p.m. service, and continues with nightly services at 7:30 p.m. through Aug. 22.

Dr. Merv Rosell has just completed a united campaign in Topeka, Kansas. Cy Jackson, who serves as coordinator of the team will arrive in Eugene Monday and meet with many of the committee chairmen during the week. Mr. and Mrs. Ted Roe who will have charge of the music will arrive Friday and meet with the choir for rehearsal that night at 7:30 p.m. at the High School auditorium. Arrangements are being made for a choir of 150 voices. Cy Jackson will also meet with committees and personal counselors at that same hour at the high school.

A number of cottage prayer meetings are being held in Eugene and Springfield during the coming week. On Friday night there will be a united prayer service at Lighthouse Temple at 8 p.m. with four different pastors giving brief talks and directing the prayer periods. Liberal Religionists Gather For Annual Unitarian Meet

Unitarians will gather on the Lewis and Clark College campus, Aug. 9-15, for the annual Northwest Unitarian Conference. The theme this year will be "What Does It Mean to Be a Liberal?" Theme speaker and moderator will be the Rev. Berkeley Blake, minister of the Unitarian Church in Santa Barbara, Calif. Speaker at the services which conclude the conference will be the Rev. Edward L. Ericson of the Eugene Unitarian Church.

Berkeley Blake is a native of the Pacific Northwest; he spent his childhood in Seattle. After graduating from the University of California in 1911, he studied a year at Harvard, then returned to California for a law degree in 1913. He practiced law in San Francisco and Sacramento for 10 years and then became minister of the First Unitarian Church in Sacramento. He was subsequently field secretary for the Pacific Coast (Unitarians) for six years, before accepting the Santa Barbara ministry. He has been on the board of the Starr King School for the Ministry for approximately 20 years.

Panel discussions will be conducted by a group of three different ministers and laymen each day, with the following topics: Tuesday, "The Meaning of a Liberal Religion"; Wednesday, "The Liberal in Politics"; Thursday, "The Liberal in His Personal Relations"; Friday, "The Liberal in Current Education"; Saturday, "The Liberal in Social Issues."

There will also be daily workshops, planned recreation, and firelight services. Nursery care will be provided from 9:30 a.m. daily and there will be a daily program during those hours for children six to 14. The conference will provide a "sitter" for each floor of each dormitory for the period 8:30-11:30 p.m. A doctor and a registered nurse will be in daily attendance.

Board, room and registration costs will be: Adults, \$34 weekly, from 7 to 9:45 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall, \$14.50 weekly or \$3ship Hall.
