

# Political Refugee Taken From Ship

LONDON (AP)—A Polish stowaway seeking asylum in Britain was removed by British police Saturday night from a Polish freighter where American scientist Joseph Cort and his wife awaited departure for political asylum in Red Czechoslovakia.

The police also brought ashore another man. He was not identified immediately.

Port officials said they believed the second man was a representative of the Polish ship's captain.

The haggard stowaway, who had been reported starving, was brought off the ship just before midnight.

### CAPTAIN BALKS

High-ranking British police officials had argued with the Polish ship captain for 85 minutes before he was taken off.

Among the police in the argument was Sir John Nott-Bower,

top commissioner of Scotland Yard.

The stowaway, Antoni Klimowicz, 24, and the unidentified man were brought ashore in one of ten police launches that had circled the Polish ship all evening.

Police squads lined the jetty as the launch approached. The thin-faced Klimowicz, wearing a blue muffler, marched with the other man to a police station under close guard.

The Royal Navy alerted a destroyer to stand by the Polish ship during the night.

### REFUSED ASYLUM

The Home Office said the 3,219-ton freighter Jaroslaw Dabrowski was free to sail away with Cort at once if her master surrendered Klimowicz.

Britain refused asylum for Cort, the 26-year-old self-styled ex-Communist physiologist from Boston, Mass.

# Sweetland Hits Restrictions On Licensees

MILWAUKEE (AP)—Monroe Sweetland, Democratic national committeeman and state Senate candidate from Clackamas county, Saturday asked the attorney general's office for an opinion on the validity of Oregon Liquor Control Commission restrictions on political activities of licensees.

The state Democratic party leader said recent rulings of the commission that licensees face prosecution if they participate in political action or discussion or permit others to do so while on their premises virtually deprive them of effective citizenship.

Sweetland said under the rulings no store, restaurant or other licensed premises may display posters relating to any issue or election, permit the circulation of literature or petitions therein, or may the licensee be a candidate for office or contribute to a candidate or measure. It is unsound public policy, Sweetland claimed, to restrict citizens engaged in lawful business from full participation in public affairs.

# Sheppard Jailed, Grilled by Police

CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP)—Authorities sought Saturday to extract a confession from Dr. Samuel Sheppard for the independence day slaying of his pregnant wife, Marilyn.

Sheppard was charged with murder in the first degree Friday night after he apparently was trapped in a lie by a statement of his former mistress.

The 30-year-old osteopath was being confronted Saturday with the story of illicit relations volunteered by Susan Hayes, 24.

Miss Hayes, a former co-worker of Sheppard, said she and Sheppard had been intimate on numerous occasions and that Sheppard had discussed marriage with her.

Sheppard testified under oath that he and the former technician at the Sheppard family's hospital in Bay Village were only "casuals friends." He denied having dates or being intimate with her.

Sheppard was picked up Friday night at the home of his

father, Dr. Richard A. Sheppard, Sr., less than an hour after a murder warrant was issued by Bay Village Law Director Richard Weygant.

Clad in a T-shirt and light slacks, Sheppard listened with a look of disbelief as the charge was read in a room filled with reporters, photographers and village residents.

Sheppard shook his head as if saying, "no, no, no," as he was charged with the fatal beating of his 31-year-old wife.

Dr. Sheppard has said he was awakened from a downstairs couch by his wife's screams. He said he was knocked out when he rushed to his wife's aid. When he came to and spotted a figure on the porch of their Lake Erie beach home, he was knocked out in another struggle, he said.

It was reported that the current grand jury, which ended its session, may be held over for the Sheppard case. Preliminary hearings will be held Aug. 7.
