DRAIN—Thirteen local swimmers and divers and three each from Cottage Grove and one from Yoncalla will give the southern end of the Emerald Empire formidable representation at the Register-Guard's all-area championships at Springfield next Thursday night.

The Drain-Grove district meet was held here Thursday afternoon with slightly more interest and increased prowess. The addition of the Cottage Grove contingent aided in making the meet successful and the Grovers may have the opportunity of staging the district meet next year in their own pool. Plans for the pool, to be constructed in time for use next spring, will be discussed later this week.

Best individual performance here Thursday was by Janice Mattoon, a perennial title threat who won four first places in the 13-14 year division. There was also a triple winner for Drain, Larry Brown in the 15-16 division, and three double winners—Bob Henderson and Del Dungey, both 11-12, and Jill Evans, 15-16. Kathie Wood of Yoncalla was also a double winner.

Cottage Grove had two triple winners—Bonnie Simonette in the 11-12 division and Stan Harris in the 13-14 year division.

All first-place winners here Thursday will qualify for the championship meet at the Willamalane pool in Springfield, starting promptly at 7 p.m.
