WASHINGTON (AP)—Chairman Strauss of the Atomic Energy Commission predicts that the use of atomic energy will open the way to swift advancement in the use of power.

He said the statement, Tuesday, after the House of Representatives passed a measure and sent it to the President for his signature.

Navy Tests 'Flying LST'

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—The Navy is testing its 80-ton seaplane capable of putting 103 men directly ashore in amphibious warfare operations.

The ReY2, the Navy says, is the first plane designed to put soldiers, tanks and other equipment directly on the beach.

Tests for the "flying LST" were made Wednesday at a floating drydock in San Diego Bay. The turbo-prop, four-engine transport later will put men and equipment directly ashore on sandy beaches.

The Navy says it will have a fleet of the planes, built by the Convair division of General Dynamics Corp., in operation this year.

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Palm Print Identified in Sheppard Murder

CLEVELAND (AP)—A Cuyahoga County official says identification of a palm print found in the lake-front home where pretty Marilyn Sheppard was slain knocks the props from under a defense argument of her osteopath husband. The print, which has puzzled investigators since Mrs. Sheppard's battered body was discovered July 4, belongs to her 7-year-old son.

Chip, Asst. County Prosecutor John J. Mahon said Wednesday. Now, Mahon said, Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard, 30, can't use the print to support his story a stranger was in the house the morning of the murder. Sheppard has been indicted on a charge of first-degree murder. He says a prowler murdered his 31-year-old wife, an expectant

mother, and then injured him when he answered her call for help. Authorities had collected prints from dozens of persons who might have been in the house before obtaining those of the youngster, who had been at a summer camp in Pennsylvania from the morning of the killing until last week. Police fingerprint expert Jer-

ome C. Peolking said it was the only legible print found after the bludgeoning. It was on a desk in the study, where papers had been strewn and drawers pulled out. Sheppard reaffirmed his innocence Wednesday in a 900-word statement released by his brother, Dr. Stephen Sheppard. In it, he said: "I am more interested in the capture of my wife's murderer than any other person in the world."
