### Report Given By Witnesses On Convention

"What is wrong with mankind today is their disobedience to the Bible's two great commandments to love," several hundred persons from Eugene and vicinity were told in Portland, Oregon, Aug. 8. They were among 9,435 Jehovah's Witnesses and friends from the Pacific Northwest who heard H. E. Miller of Brooktown, representative of the Watchtower Bible & Tract Society, speak on "God's Love to the Rescue in Man's Crisis."

The Portland assembly was the last one of 21 district conventions held in the United States and Canada during June, July and August. Tentative arrangements are being made for about 100 from Eugene and vicinity to attend a series of international conventions scheduled for Europe in 1955. Over 10,000 Witnesses from the United States have already made advanced reservations to travel to Europe and many more anticipate making the trip.

The first convention will be held in London the last week in July, Paris the following week, and cities in Germany, Sweden and Italy on the following weeks. Prior to the European assemblies the Witnesses will hold five assemblies in the United States.

Starting with the first in the Pacific Northwest and on successive weeks in Los Angeles, Dallas, Chicago, and New York City. The Yankee Stadium will be used for the New York Assembly. This will be the third assembly that the Witnesses have held in this stadium.
