

Airline Pilots Reach 'Truce'

American Plans To Resume Flights

WASHINGTON (AP)—American Airlines and its striking pilots have reached a partial settlement—but whether pilots will return to work in advance of a full agreement remains in dispute.

American said Sunday night it plans to resume operations Wednesday after a 23-day shutdown. It said the pilots would at that time return to work, manning disputed transcontinental nonstop flights.

A spokesman for the AFL Airline Pilots Assn. said, however, that the arrangement worked out Sunday with the help of federal mediators was a truce, not a final settlement.

8-HOUR ISSUE

The union spokesman did not make clear whether the "truce" included an agreement to end the strike. Local unions in Nashville, Tenn., and Fort Worth, Tex., said their negotiators in Washington had instructed them not to return to work until all details of a strike-ending settlement are worked out.

Pilots struck in protest against the scheduling of westbound nonstop transcontinental flights of more than eight hours. They demanded a crew-change stopover.

J. J. O'Connell, master council chairman of the union, said, "We want it clearly understood that it's only a truce. There are a lot of things that still have to be worked out." One is the selection of a neutral party to recommend a non-binding solution for the dispute.

4-POINT PROPOSAL

A neutral study was part of a national mediation board proposal for ending the walkout.

1. Resumption of nonstop west-bound flights.
2. No other flights of more than eight hours.
3. No loss of seniority or other action against pilots, who would return to duty as their services were needed.
4. Appointment of a neutral to recommend a permanent solution.

Vice President to Campaign For Republican Candidates

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower has assigned Vice President Nixon to campaign for Republican Senate and governor candidates in a series of tours which will take him into about two thirds of the states before the November election.

While the President plans visits to several states, he apparently is counting on Nixon as a stand-in for the kind of openly political campaigning he himself doesn't like to undertake.

Nixon, on a 10-day vacation in Maine, will assay the political situation in conference with individual members of the Republican National Committee in a three-day workshop session at Cincinnati from Aug. 30 through Sept. 1.

Eisenhower and Nixon apparently won't waste any time campaigning in the South. Eisenhower has said he has no plans to speak in Dixie. Nixon will invade Kentucky and possibly some other border states but will go no farther south.

Tanks Guarding Brazilian Palace

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP)—after a day-long huddle between Army tanks rallied to the defense of embattled Brazilian President Getulio Vargas Monday as the air force pressed for his resignation. The tanks rumbled into position around the presidential palace after Radio Nacional reported Sunday night that Vargas had rejected air force demands that he step down.

TROOPS ALERTED

Troops and police throughout the Rio area already had been placed on the alert.

One newspaper quoted the battle-seasoned ex-dictator as saying he would leave his palace "only dead."

As rumors spread through the tense capital, the government radio periodically broadcast assurances by Vargas' military chief of staff, Caetano de Castro, that all was calm at the palace and pledges that the armed forces would fulfill their constitutional duty to uphold the presidency.

One rumor said War Minister Zenobio da Costa had ordered army units to prepare to take over the Galeao air base.

MIDNIGHT PARLEY

Other reports said opposition radio stations were operating under a lid of censorship and that international telephone lines to New York were "out of order."

Radio Nacional said earlier that Vargas was holding a midnight parley with military and civil leaders.

The sudden turn of events came

after a day-long huddle between army and air force chiefs. The army men said later a "worthy solution" had been found for the crisis resulting from charges that members of the presidential guard were involved in an assassination plot against anti-Vargas editor Carlos Lacerda.

MAJOR SLAIN

The attempt resulted in the slaying of popular Air Force Maj. Ruben Vaz and brought rumbles of resentment from air force leaders which culminated in the resignation demands.

Radio Nacional quoted Vargas as replying, "I can never accede to such a proposal."

The pro-Vargas Continental Radio went on the air at 1:30 a.m., saying it believed the situation was well in hand.

Six persons were under arrest in the assassination case, including several members of the palace guard which Vargas has since disbanded.

Senate Clerk Shoots Wife

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate's 45-year-old paymaster, Joseph C. Ellis, shot and wounded his wife Sunday, then killed himself, police reported.

A son, Joseph 17, said he believed his father had overworked during the long Senate sessions before adjournment. As financial clerk, he handled Senate expenses and a payroll for about 2,000 persons.

Ellis and his wife, Elizabeth, were taken to Emergency Hospital after the shooting in their Northwest Side home. Ellis died a half hour later of a head wound. His wife was shot in the face.

Police said the son gave this account:

Hearing a shot, he ran from the basement to the first floor and found his father standing over his bleeding mother, gun in hand. Young Ellis grappled for the gun but the father pulled away and fired one shot into his own head.

Magsaysay Orders Indonesian Roundup

MANILA (AP)—President Ramon Magsaysay, reported concerned over recent reports of Communist infiltration of the Philippines, Sunday night ordered the armed forces to round up an estimated 6,000 Indonesians who have entered the country illegally.

A House of Representatives sub-committee currently is investigating Red movement into the Philippines from Indonesia.

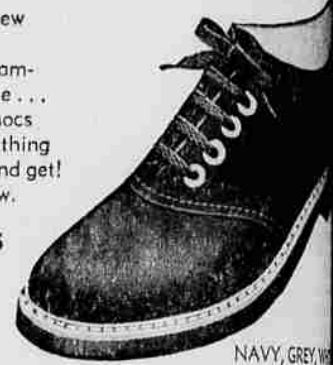
