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Side Notes from Evanston;
To Ruffle or Not to Ruffle?

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP)—Little dramas flitter continually around the edges of the big World Council of Churches Assembly while the main event ebbs with profound words and grave issues.

A wave of perplexity and dismay has arisen among some of the area's laundries and cleaning shops.

When deliverymen bring in the great cassocks, veils, hoods and strange robes worn by some of the foreign churchmen for laundering, it's often a question as to just how the garments are to be finished.

"I tell you," said a despairing laundry operator in nearby Wilmette, "we don't know whether to starch, pleat, ruffle, fold or flatten. And more than that, it's hard to tell which end is up."

This huge gathering of Christian leaders also has attracted a lot of plain men and women from all over the country, with no official status, who simply want to see, or hear or feel what it's all about.

One pretty, young mother, Mrs. Martin Fogel, drove by herself all the way from Brookings, S. D., because she wanted to give the assembly a "message from an American housewife."

"I read what was going on and I think they are missing the whole point," said Mrs. Fogel, a petite blonde. "The hope of the world is in the love of God—not in the exact way we worship Him."

Her Presbyterian pastor encouraged her to come, because "everyone must do what is clear to him." She mingles and talks with delegates outside the meeting halls.

Followers of Mohammed also have taken an interest in the Christian meeting. A special meeting of 50 Moslems and Christians was held here to further interfaith cooperation.

Men and women march outside the meeting halls carrying huge signs. One Roman Catholic layman, whose church is not represented at the meeting, carried this placard:

"All roads lead to Rome. Come home, brothers, today."

A little boy, with a grin on his face, was passing out cards with quotations printed on it from Mahatma Gandhi. This one led the series:

"A small body of determined spirits fired by an unquenchable faith in their mission can alter the course of history."

More Money

PORTLAND (AP)—The Confederated Tribes of the Siletz Indians will open a federal court hearing here Tuesday to try to collect more than eight million dollars from the government.

The Indians' attorney, E. L. Crawford, Salem, said the tribes contend the government did not pay enough for 170,000 acres of land acquired from the Indians in an 1892 treaty.

The land lies between the mouth of the Salmon River and what now is the Lincoln County line. The Indians got \$142,000 for it.

Crawford said a land appraiser, E. O. Fuller, Laramie, Wyo., will testify that they should have received \$8,858,000 more, based on 1892 values.
